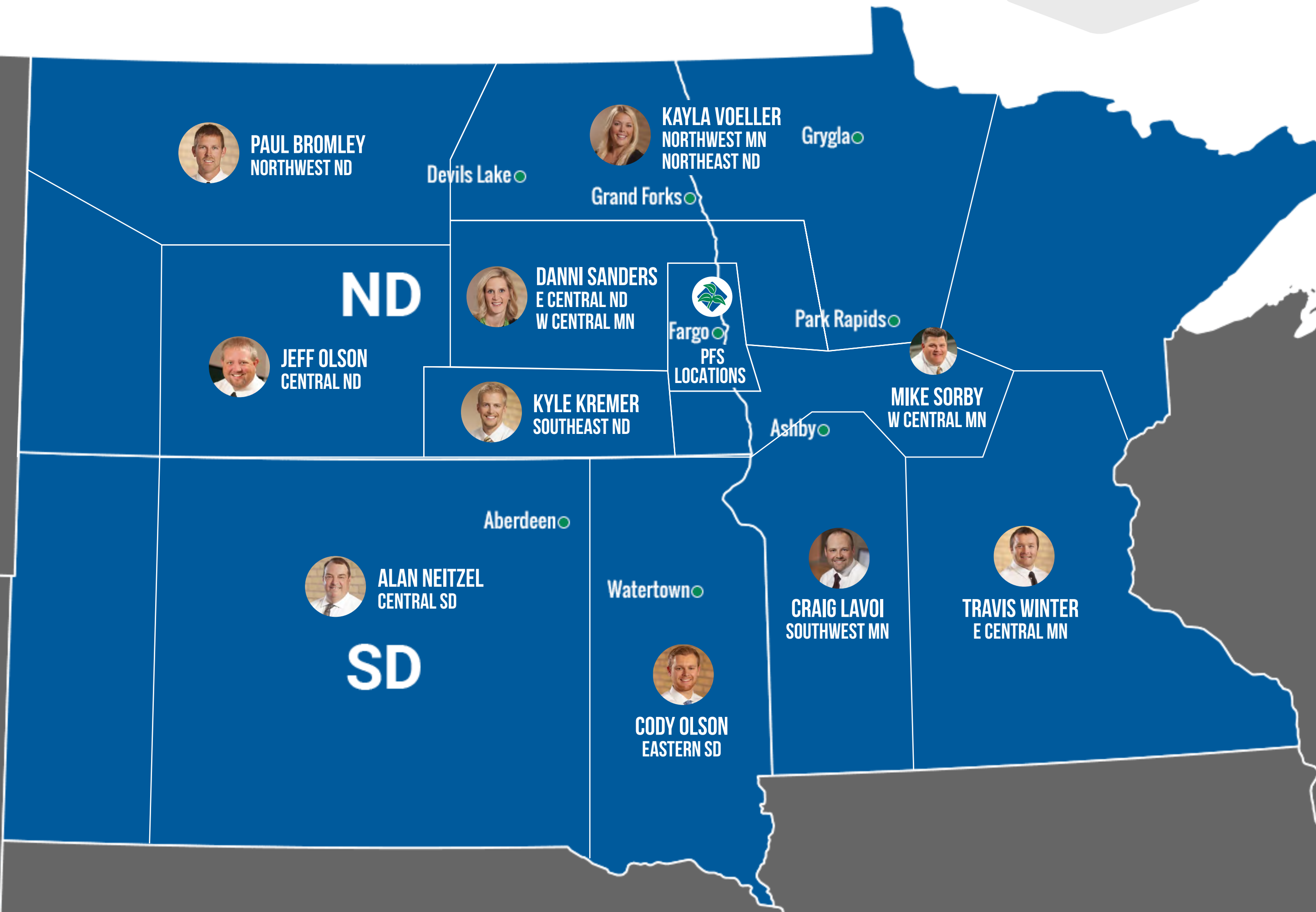

WEEKLY NOTES

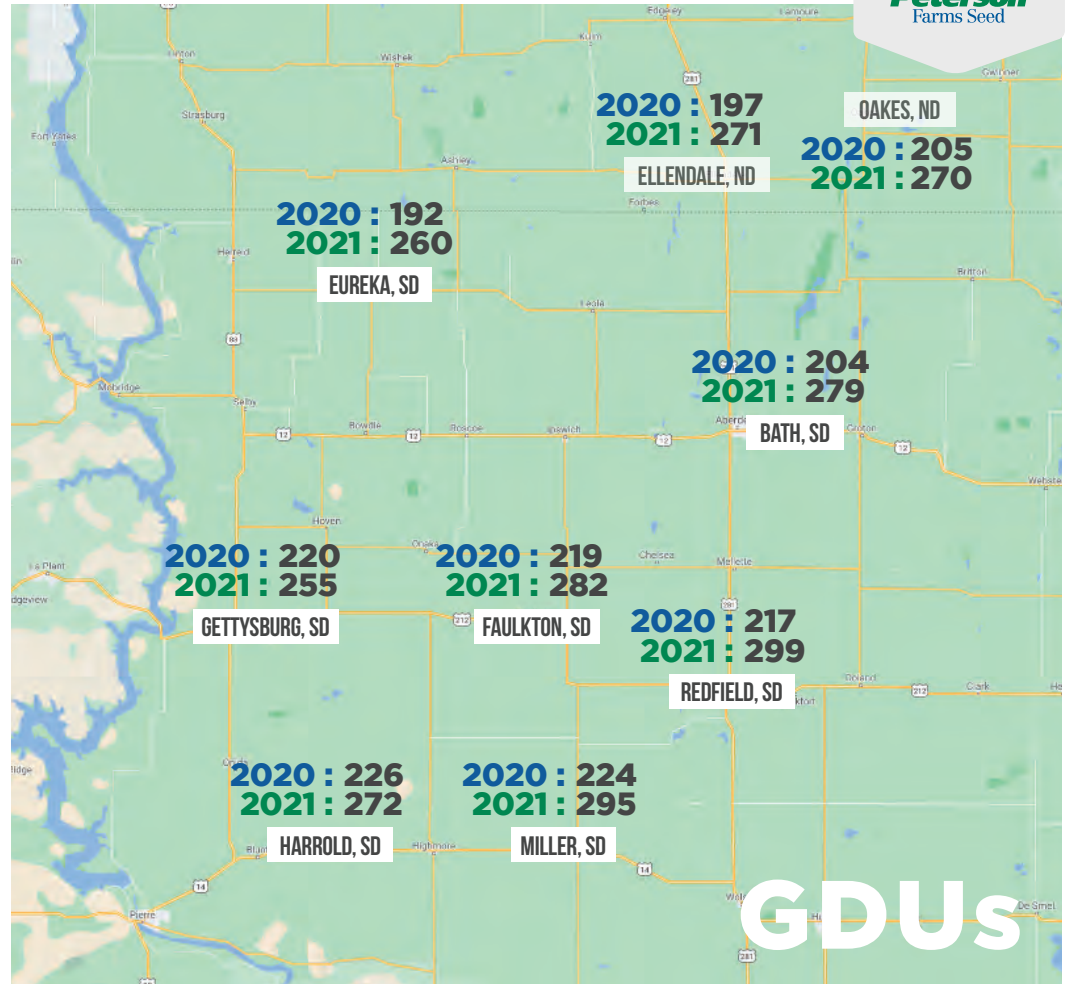

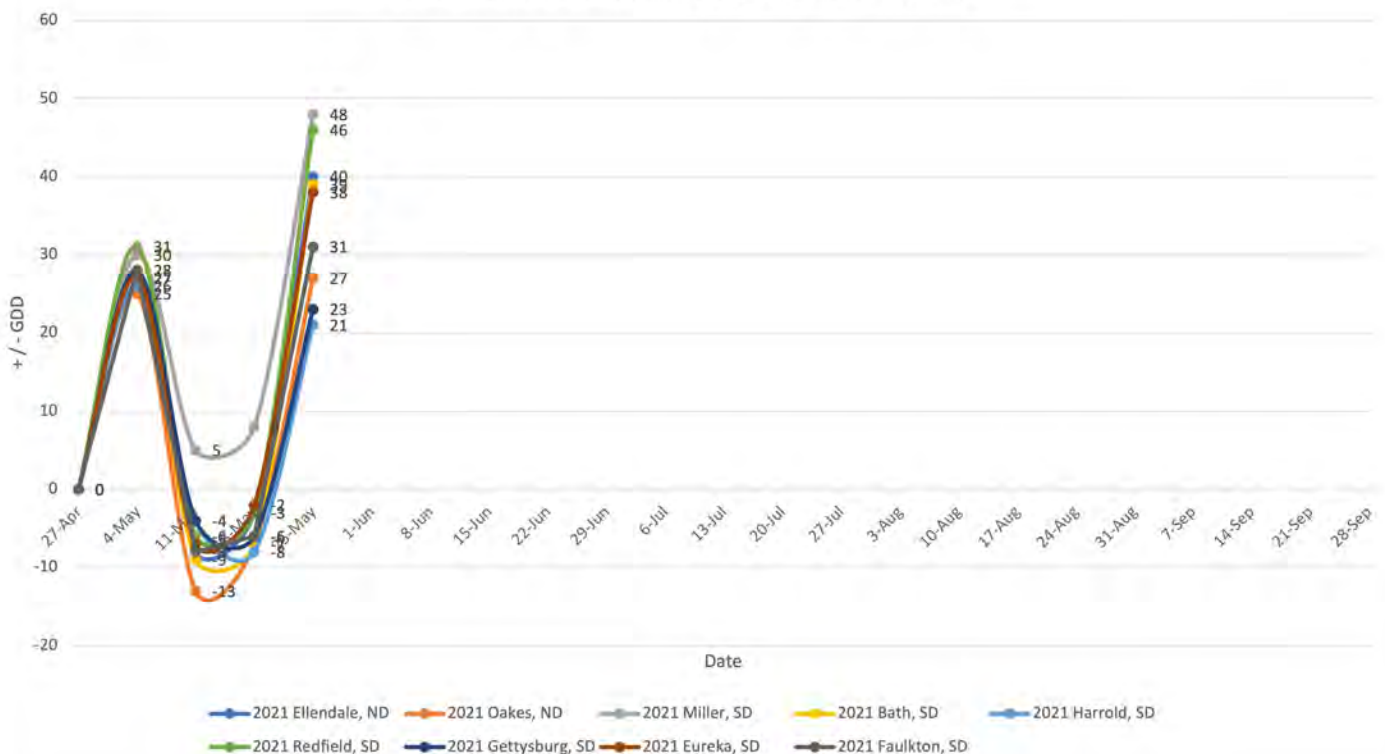

Alfalfa is getting cut this week.

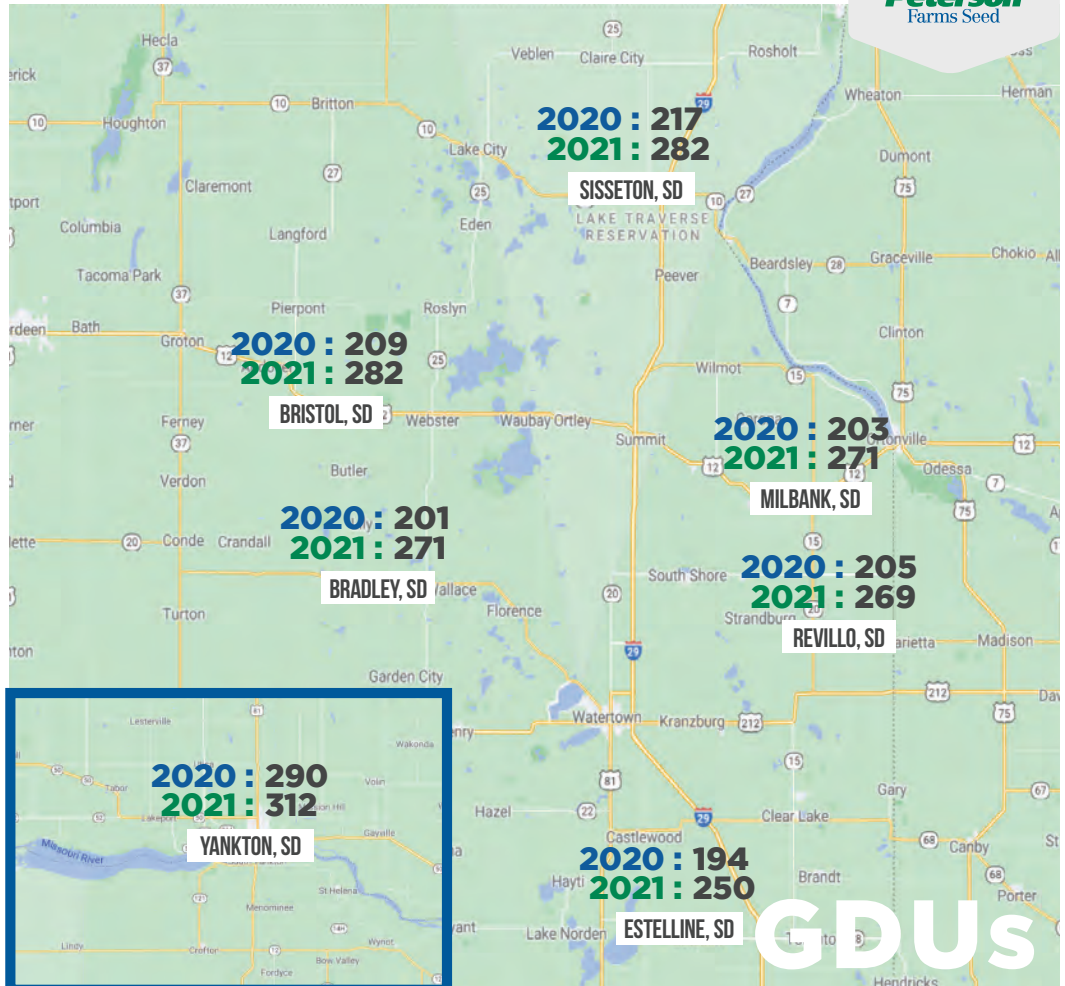
Pre-herbicides are finishing up on planted beans from the weekend.



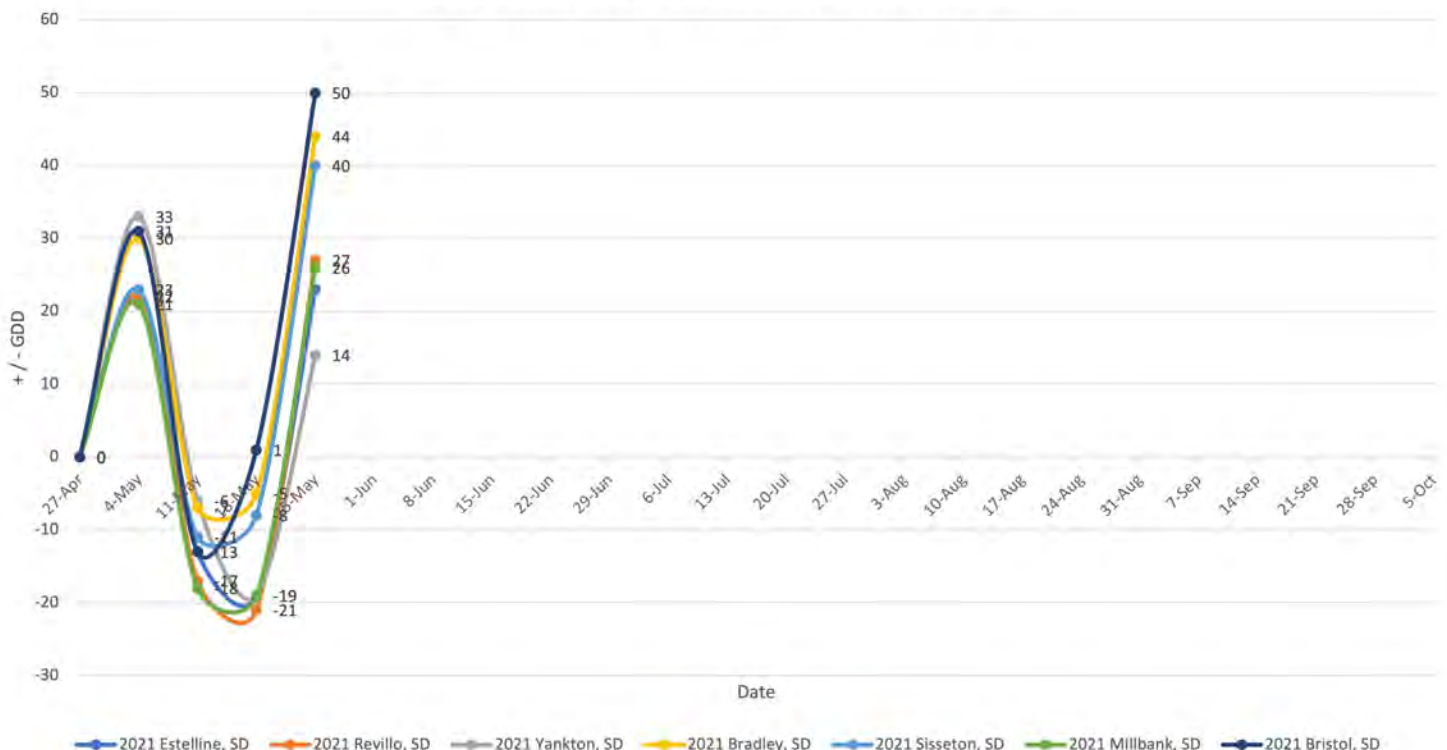

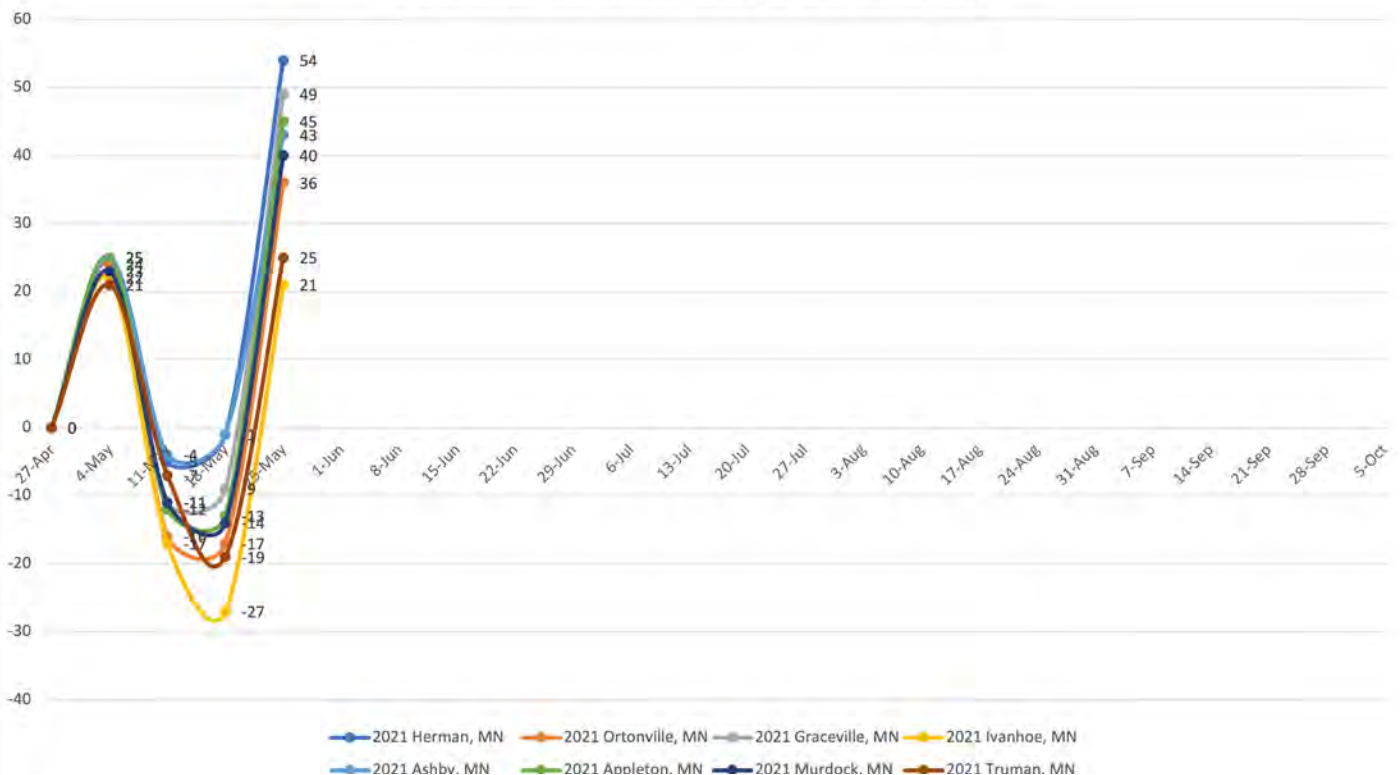
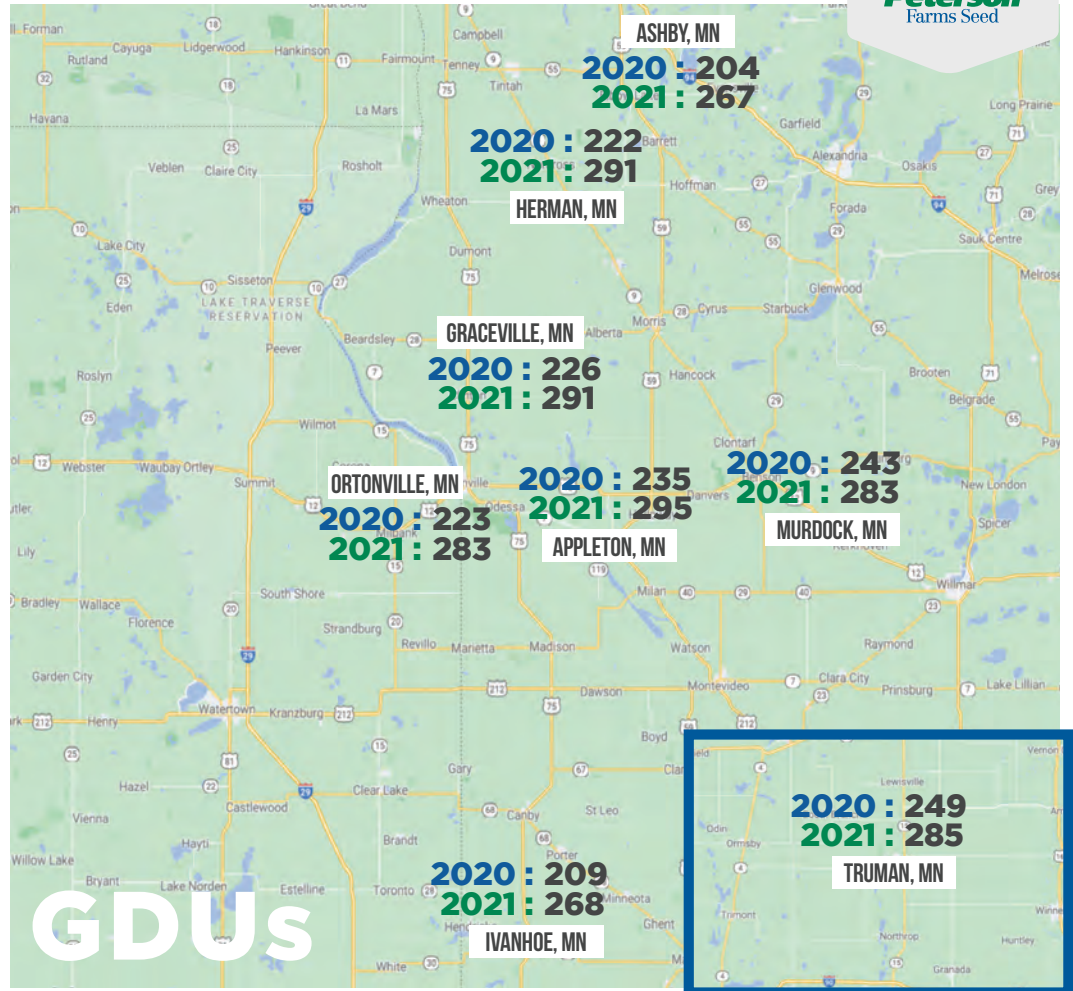

We still have a few soybeans going in the ground but we are about 95% done.

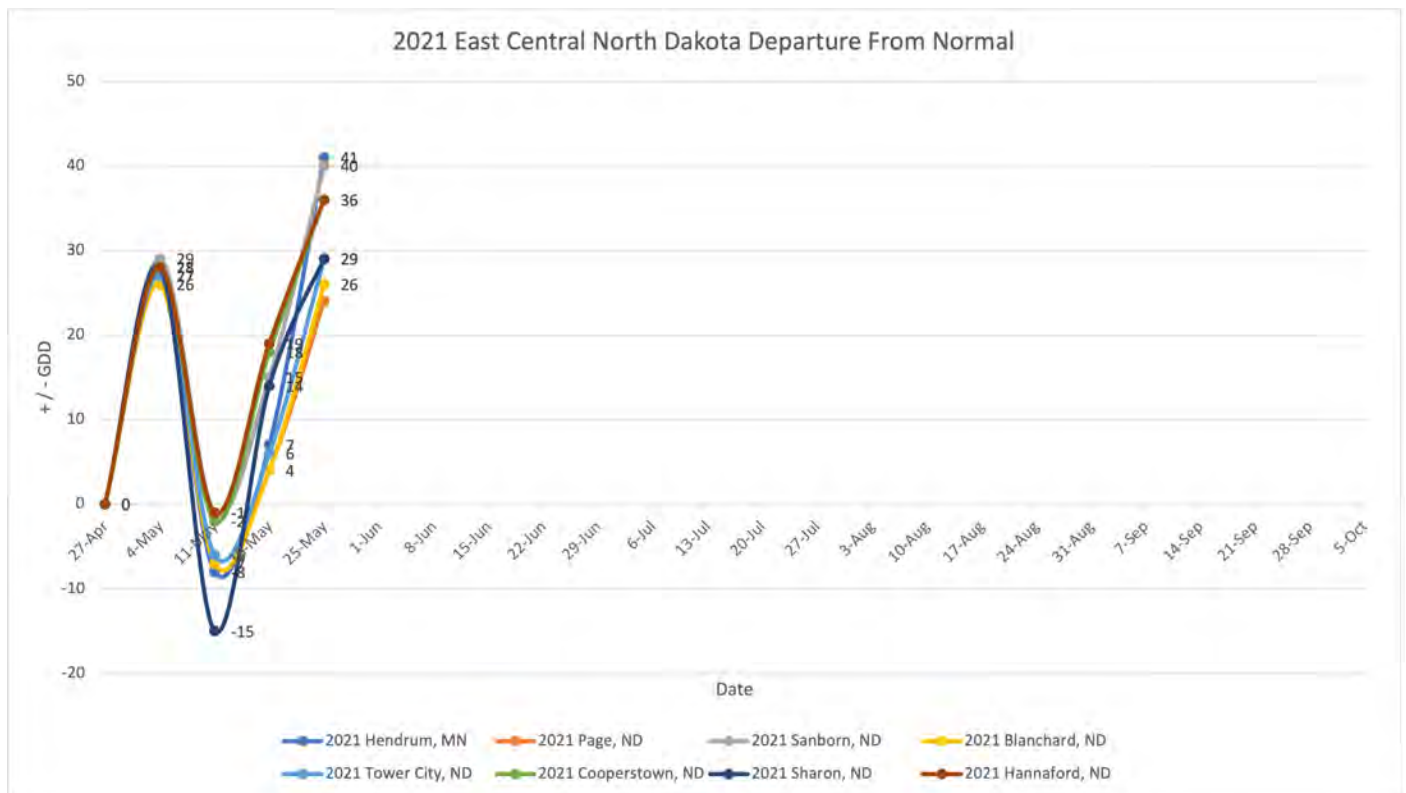
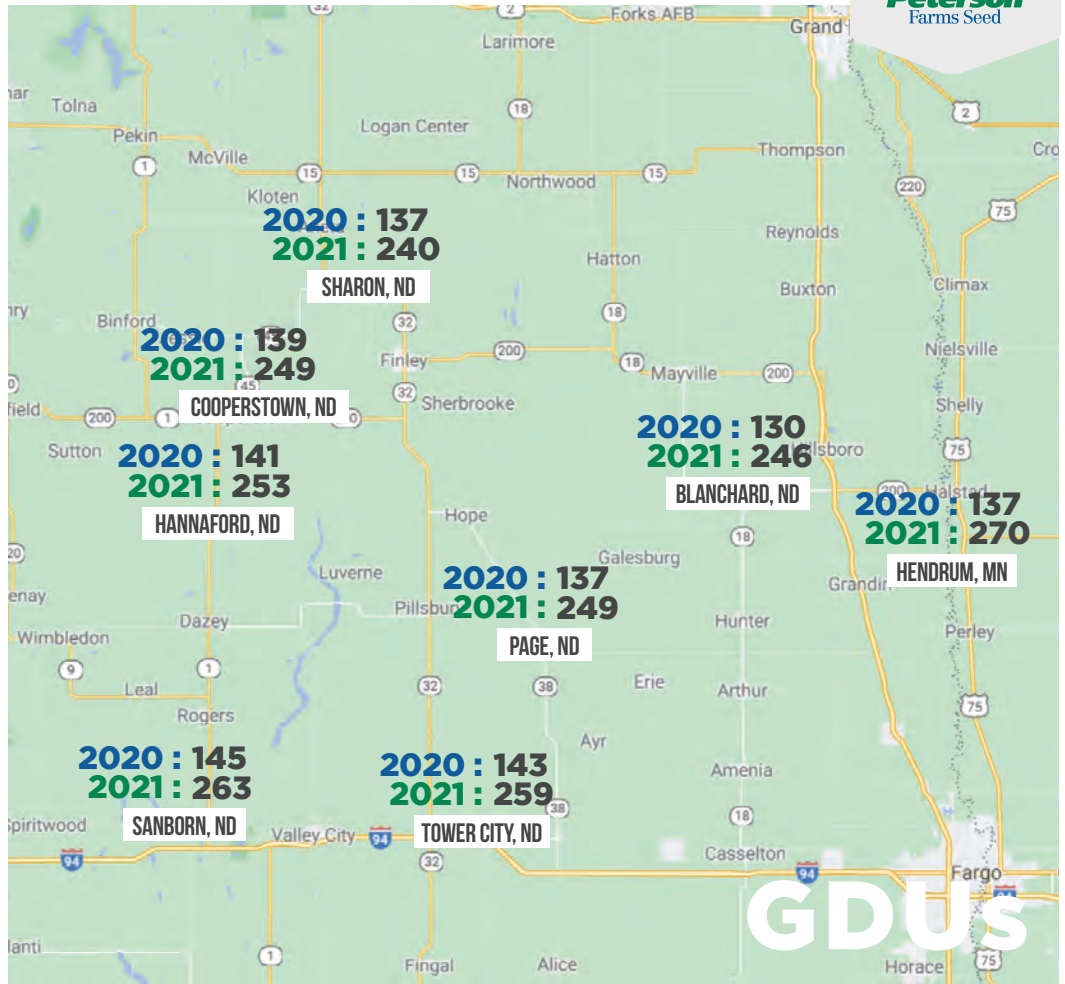
The rain last week was anywhere from 1/4" to 1" across my area. Either way, it kept farmers out of the field for a day or two, which slowed the final touches on planting.

The rain we got this weekend was huge and it should be enough to help the rest of the crop germinate.

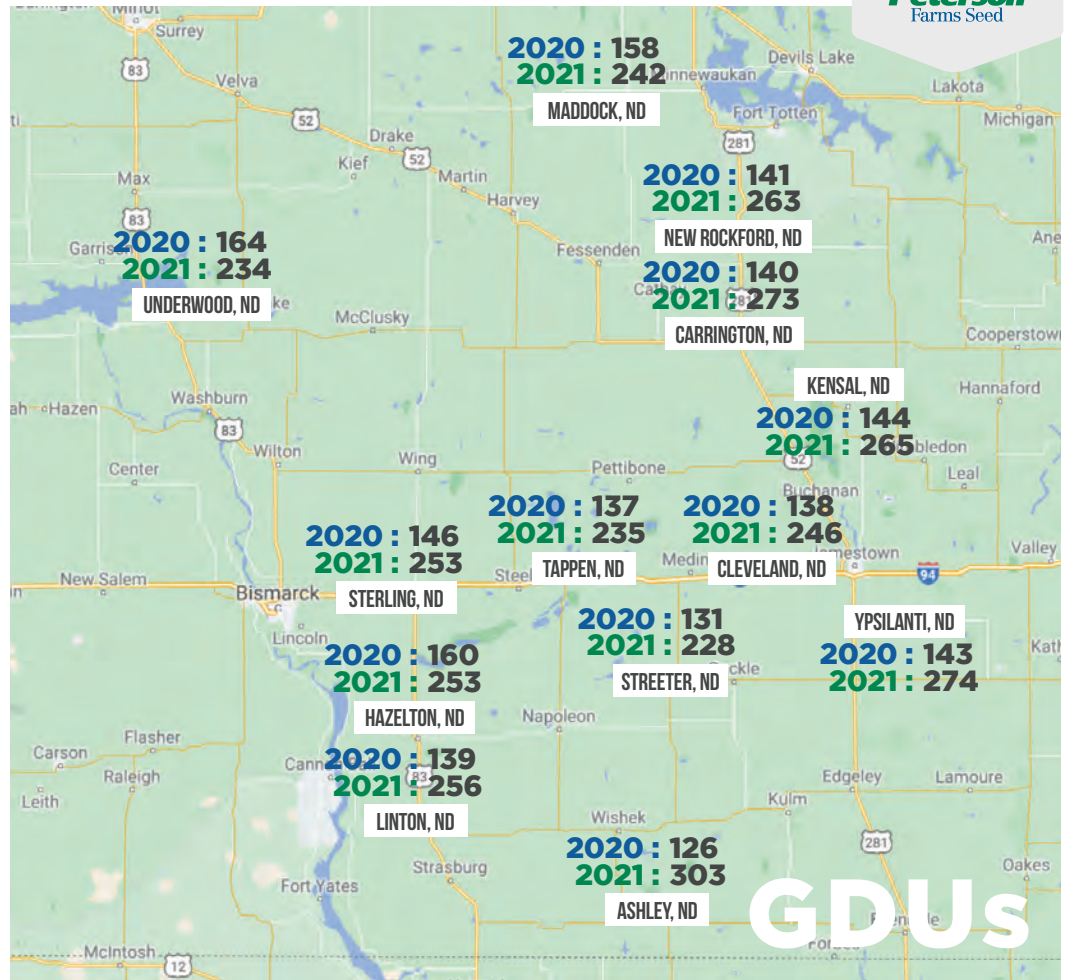
On the other hand, the wind the last two days has been terrible with some major sand blast damage happening. The upcoming heat will help push the rest of the crop out of the ground in the next week or so.

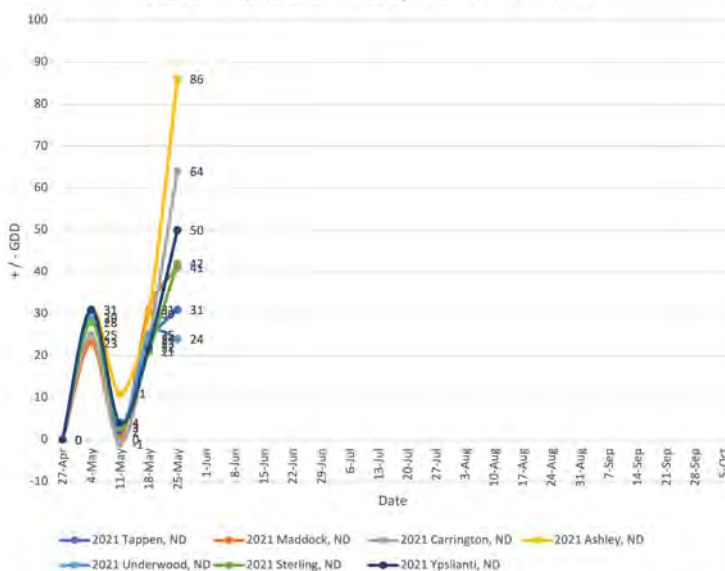

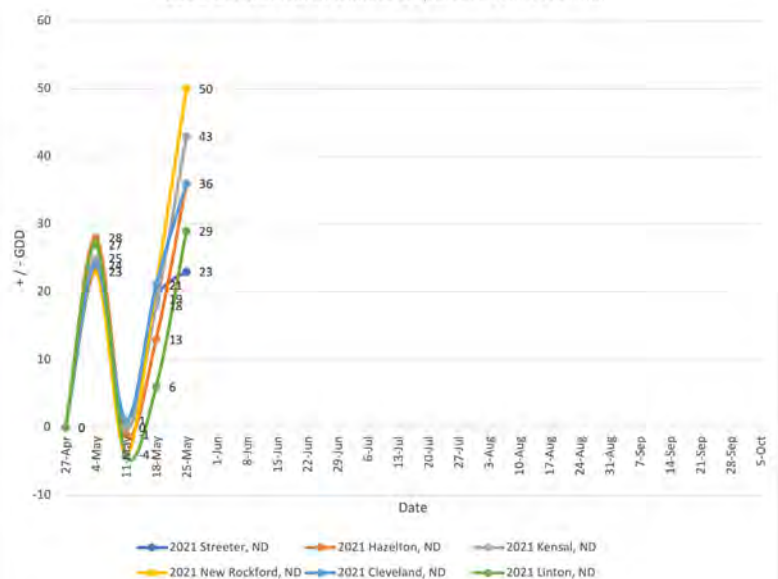

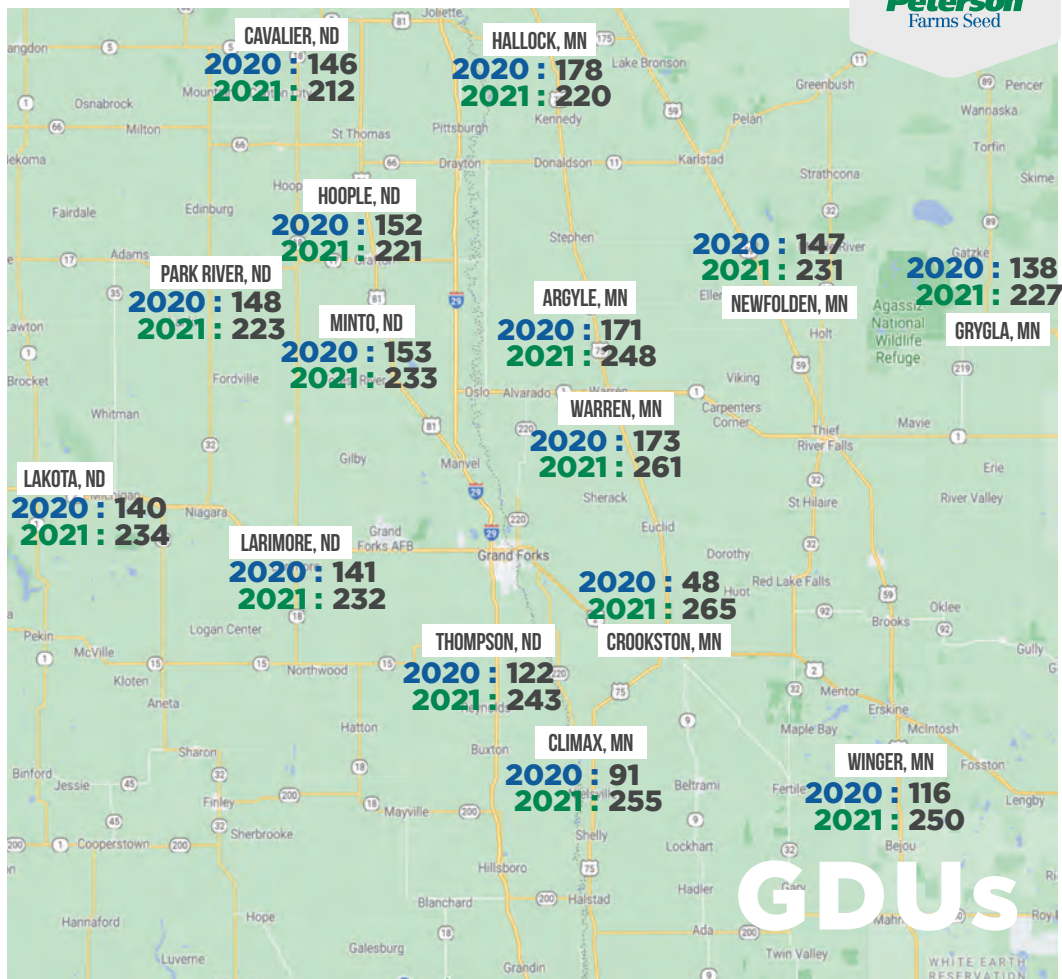
Most of the corn looks really good, with

on them was perfect.

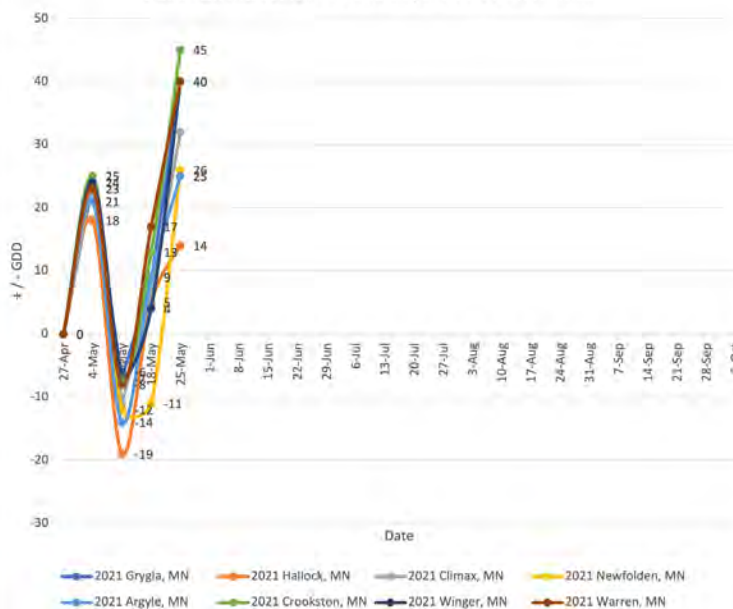

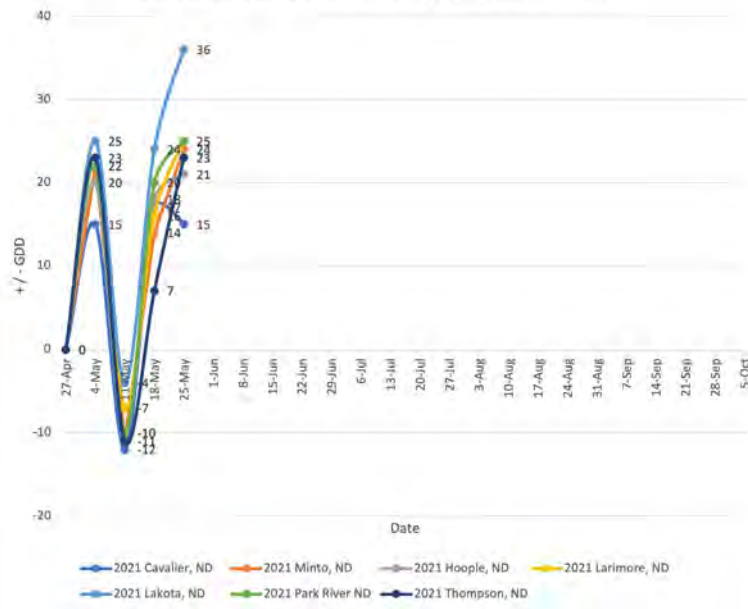

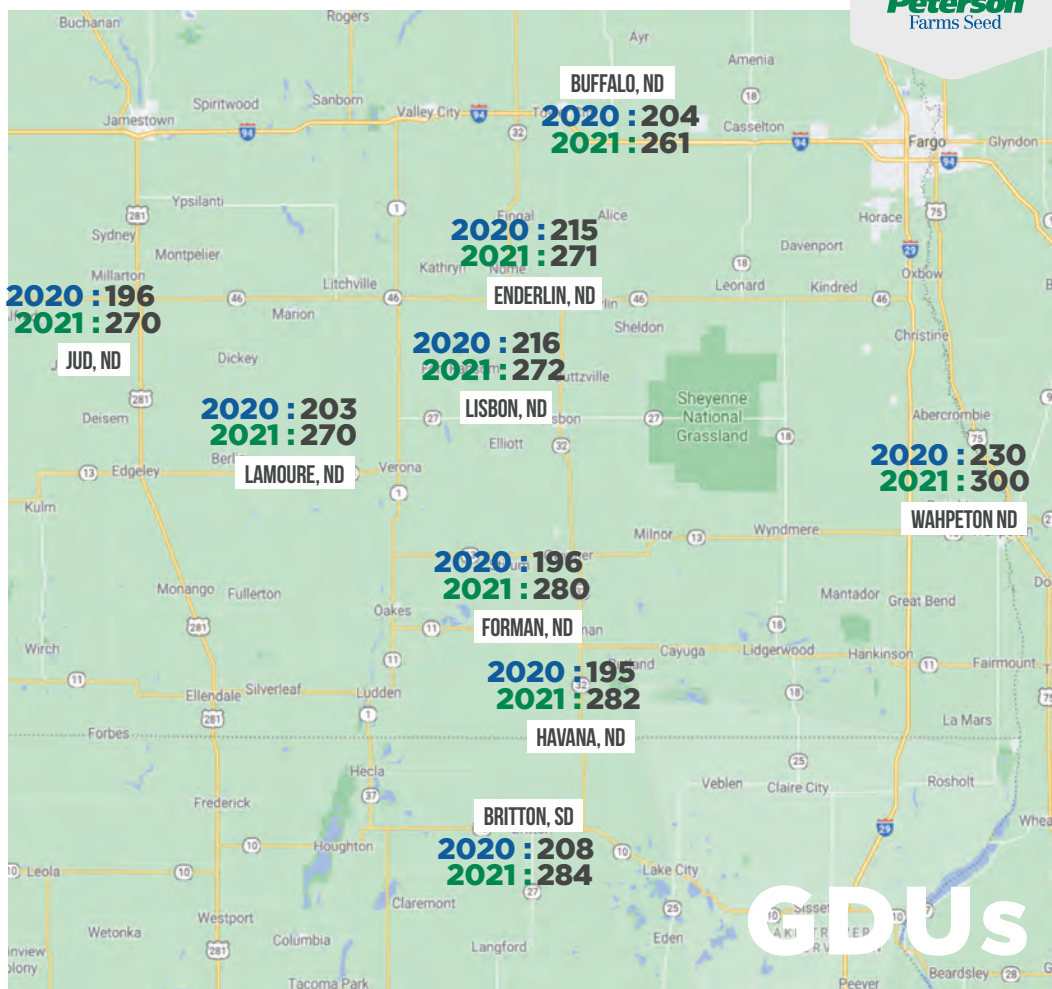
The spotty rain (.15" to 1.5" in the last 5 days) was tremendously helpful! A widespread rain in the future would help some current stand inconsistencies.



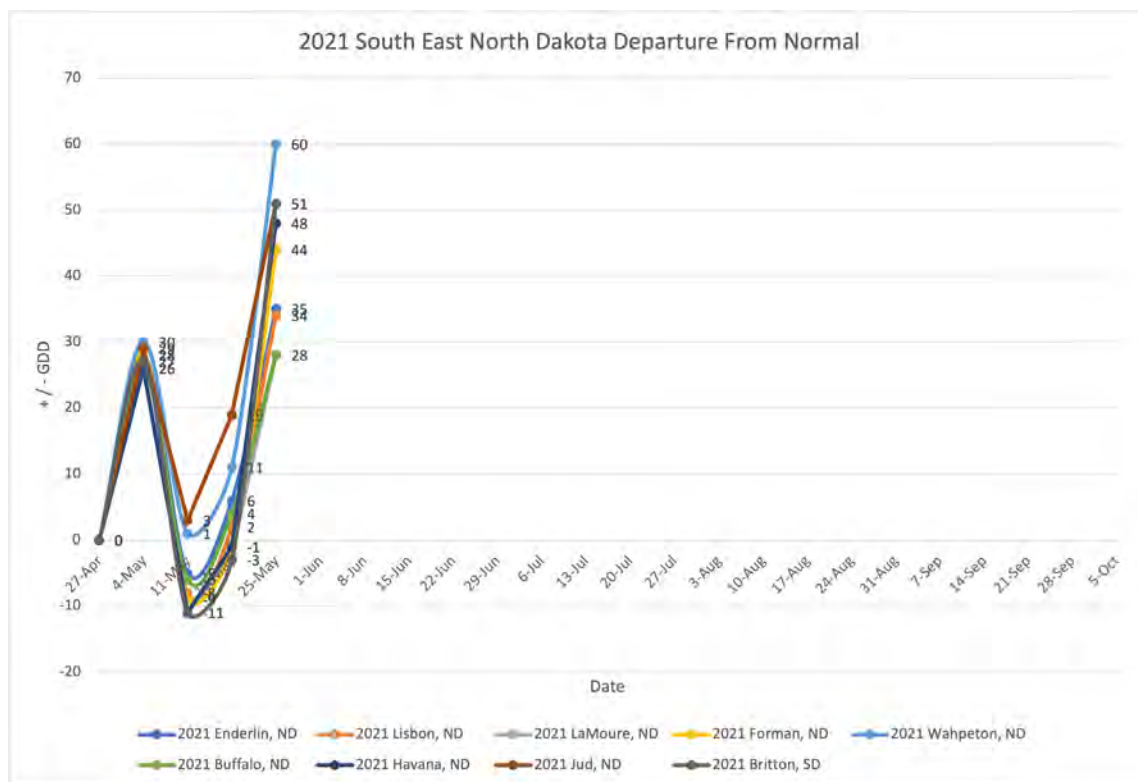

up nicely.

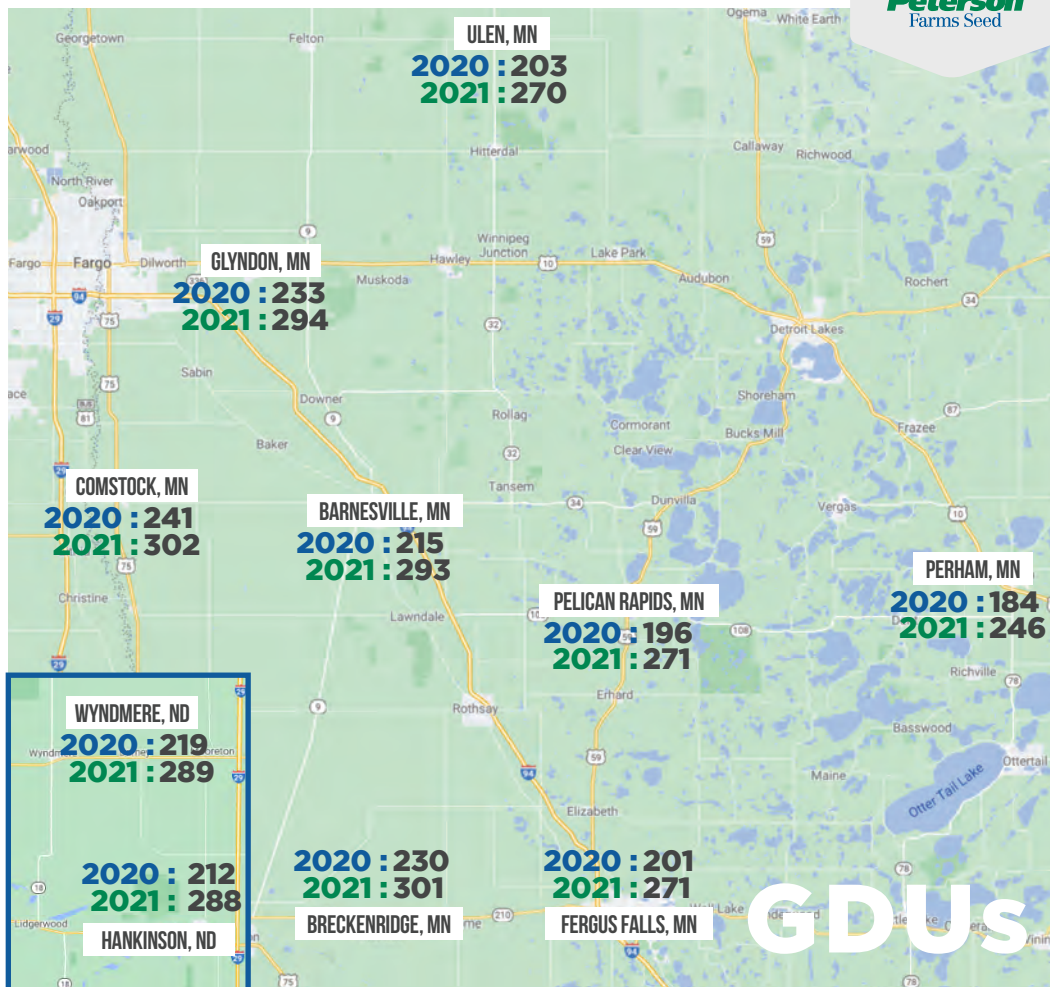
The rain last week was spotty

but not much post corn yet.



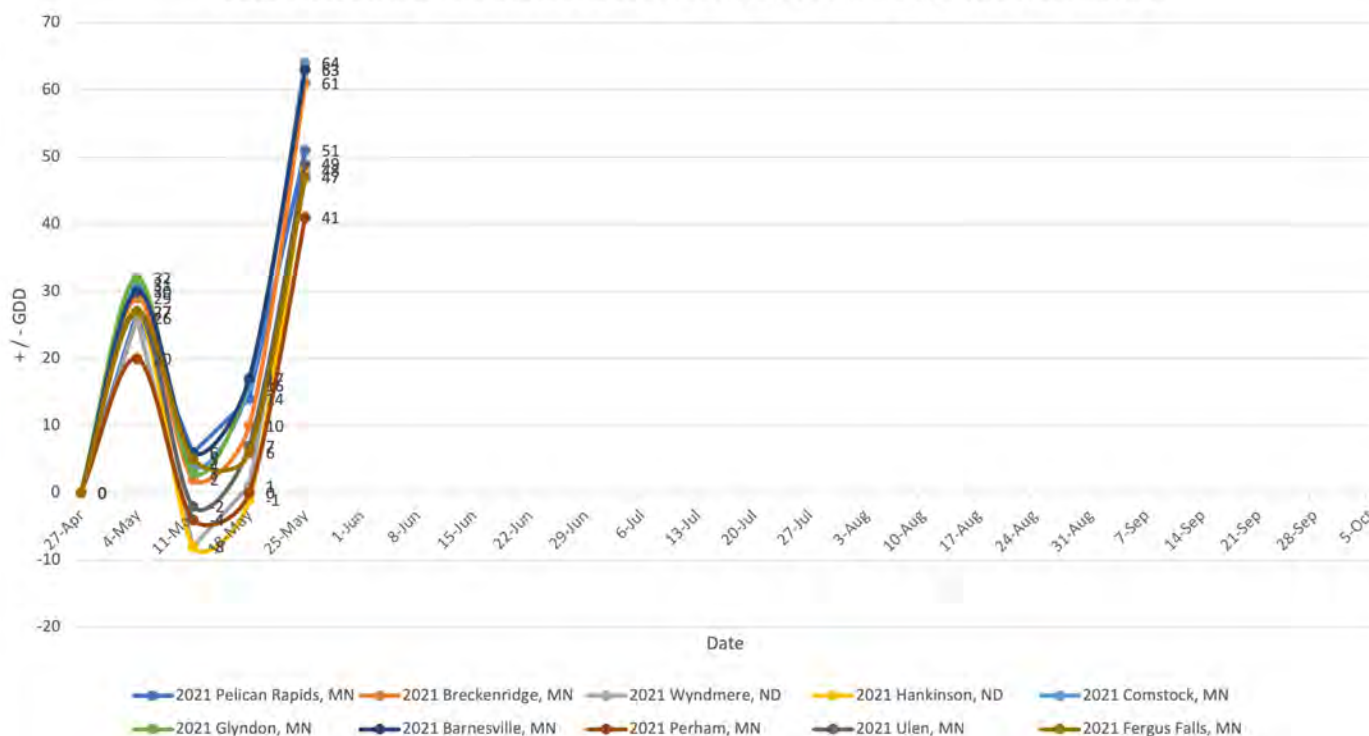

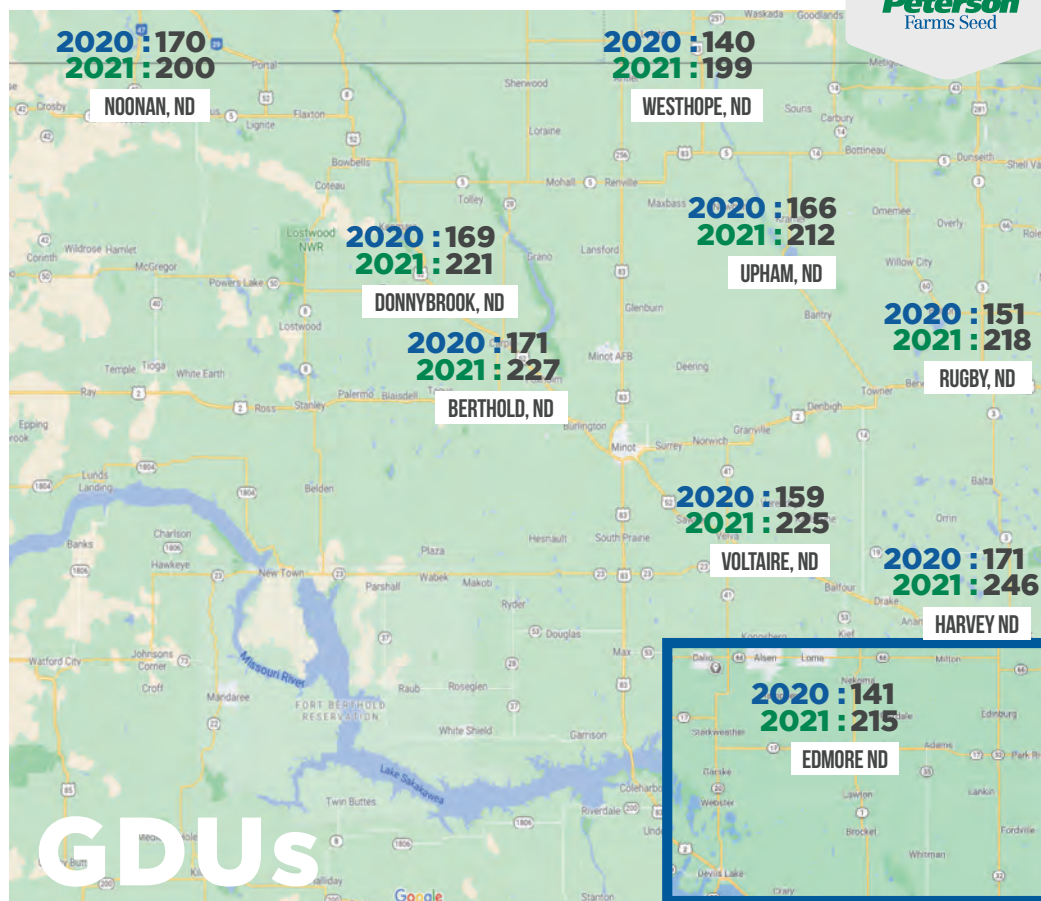
WEEKLY NOTES

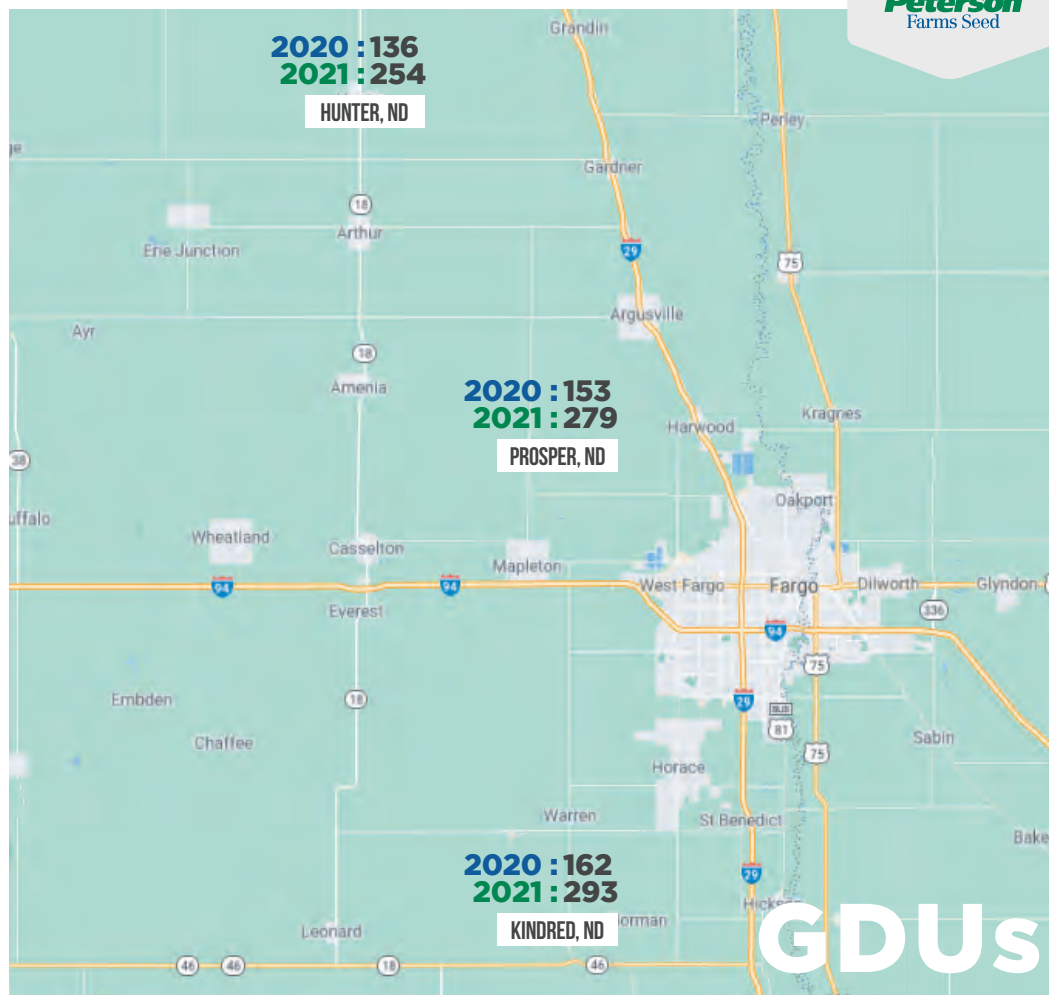


WEEKLY NOTES
