

.40 to 1.80 of rain in the last week. East of Hwy


45 saw mostly sprinkles; just enough to settle


the dust for a few hours.

dry from the heat and wind.


Alfalfa is getting cut this week.


Pre-herbicides are finishing up on — planted beans from the weekend.

the last week was very dependent on location


but, generally speaking, we did not get as


much as anticipated


We still have a few soybeans going in the ground but we are about 95% done.


The rain last week was


The rain we got this weekend was huge and it should be enough to help the rest of the crop germinate.


On the other hand, the wind the

the ground in the next week or so.



hopefully the wind early this week won't


be too hard on them. The moisture timing


on them was perfect.



5 days) was tremendously helpful! A


widespread rain in the future would help



across my whole territory.


Wheat is being sprayed for weeds


but not much post corn yet.





stands in the dry areas are common. With




