

Most of my area saw a little rain in the last week, with amounts ranging from .2" to over an inch.


The corn and soybeans look good where it rained and are still suffering where it stayed dry.


Our spring wheat is pollinating and grasshoppers are starting to apprear in areas in very large numbers.


We received just less than a half an inch of rain last week. Some areas still have had only .25" since crops were planted.


Corn is V6-V7 and bean stands are looking more normal with the bit of precipitation.

The Northwestern corner of my territory saw the most moisture this last week but amounts were variable. What IS constant is that everyone is looking for more rain.


Corn is nearing the point where staging the crop change can be done daily. The drier ground is starting to show some stress, while the heavier ground, although moisture is needed, continues to look good.


Some IDC can be found, however severity thus far is less than I have seen in the past. I believe we are also being helped by the strong IDC tolerances we offer in our soybean lineup.

We are still seeing some replants happening with Friday's storm that went through the area.


Most farmers are trying to get soybean spraying finished this week.


The Sharon area caught .8" of moisture which was sorely needed. The area now needs some time to recover from the last couple of storms.

#### **WEEKLY NOTES**




We are so thankful for the rain we did recieve, however, we still have a wide part of the territory looking for rain as the small grains need help and row crops are also struggling.






My territory picked up anywhere from 1-2" of rain from last week's storm.

The beans are really popping up and starting to look nice. The corn is also really stretching with the heat and rain.



Finally, these crops are starting to shape up in stressed areas! Last week's rain was tremendously helpful in alleviating stress.


Replants are, for the most part, done. Corn varies from V5 to V8.






The 1-2" of rain we received last week was much needed. Everyone would still like to see more.

I'm seeing a few replant beans going in the ground and while other beans are at V3. Corn is loving the heat and up to V6.


We need rain again soon as small grains are giving up.


There will be many acres getting sprayed this week.




Management practices and soil types are really starting to show up. With cooler temps, crops look pretty good in the evening but towards the middle of the day things don't look so great.

#### **WEEKLY NOTES**

Hunter: Friday's storm left anywhere from .8-2" of rain. The rain was welcomed but some damaging winds also came with it. Thankfully most everything has already recovered. Soybean replants are wrapping up. Many corn fields show some variablity from the dry conditions, with some just emerging and others on the way to V8.

Prosper: There are lots of beans being sprayed this week and the corn is completed. We haven't seen any flower on beans yet but it won't be a surprise if we see some this week. We've heard of some severe situations of grasshoppers in the ditches/beans, which is something to watch out for. The heat and lack of moisture has hammered the wheat - most is boot high and headed out or starting to head out. Sunflowers look awesome in the area as do sugar beets that handled the wind.
