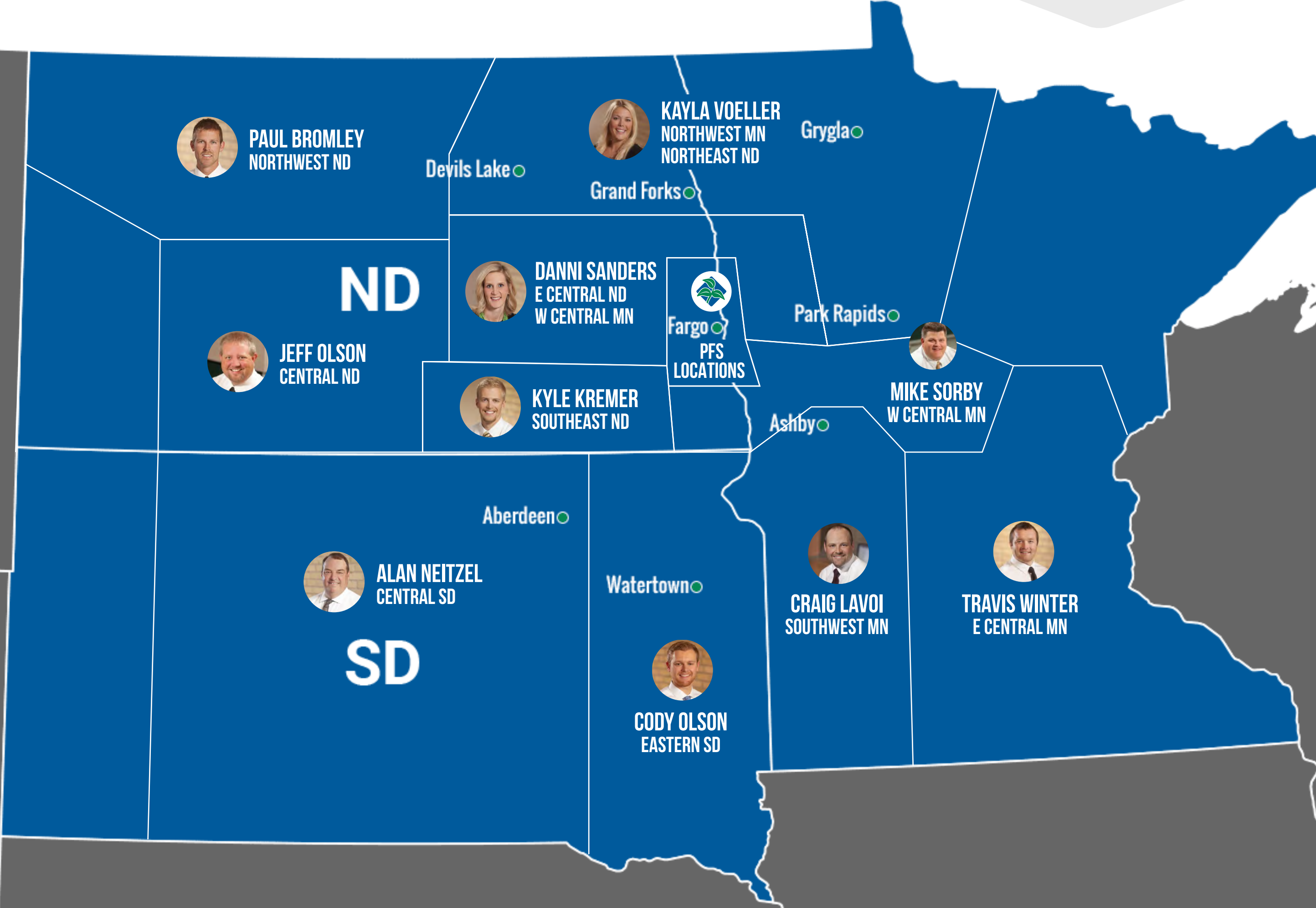

Most places got .5-1.5" of rain last Thursday and many got an additional .25".

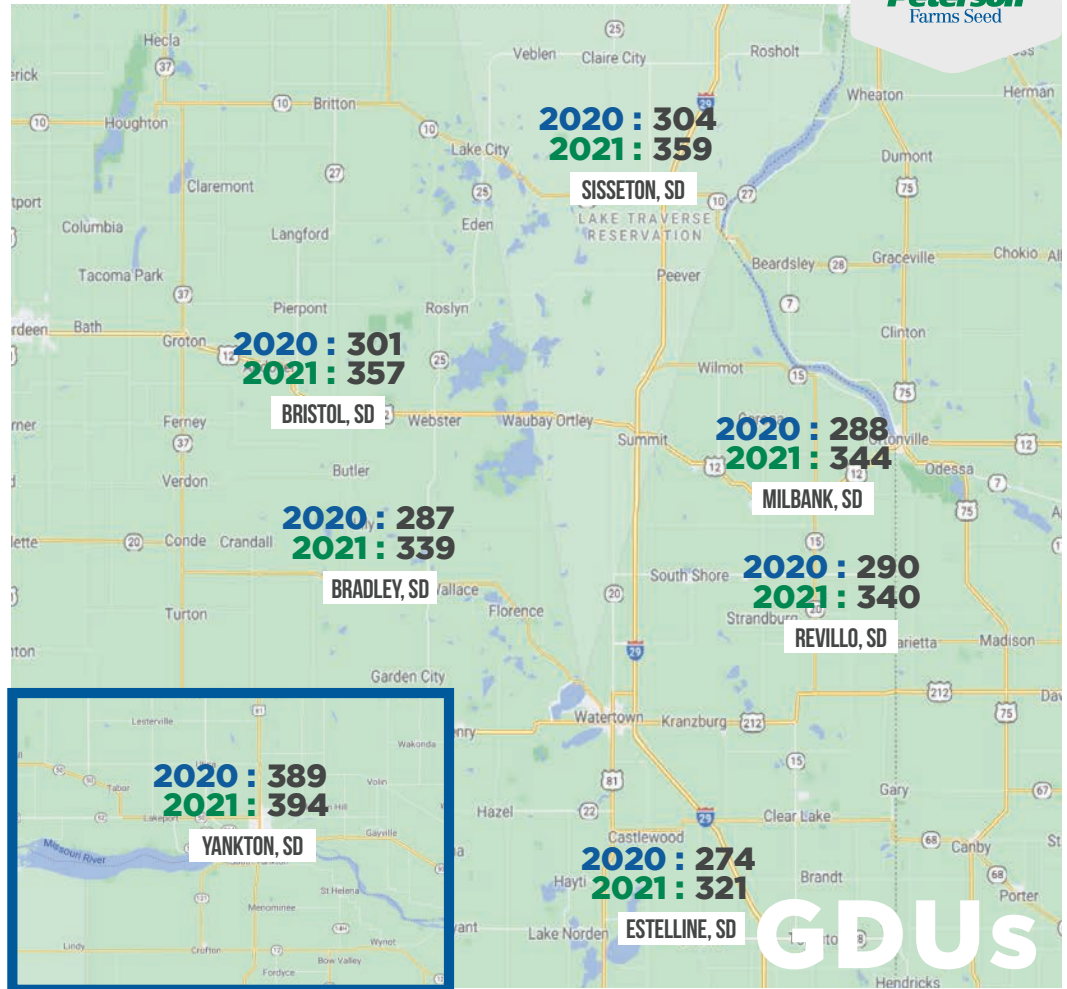
Some post corn herbicides are being applied this week and more alfalfa is getting cut around the area.



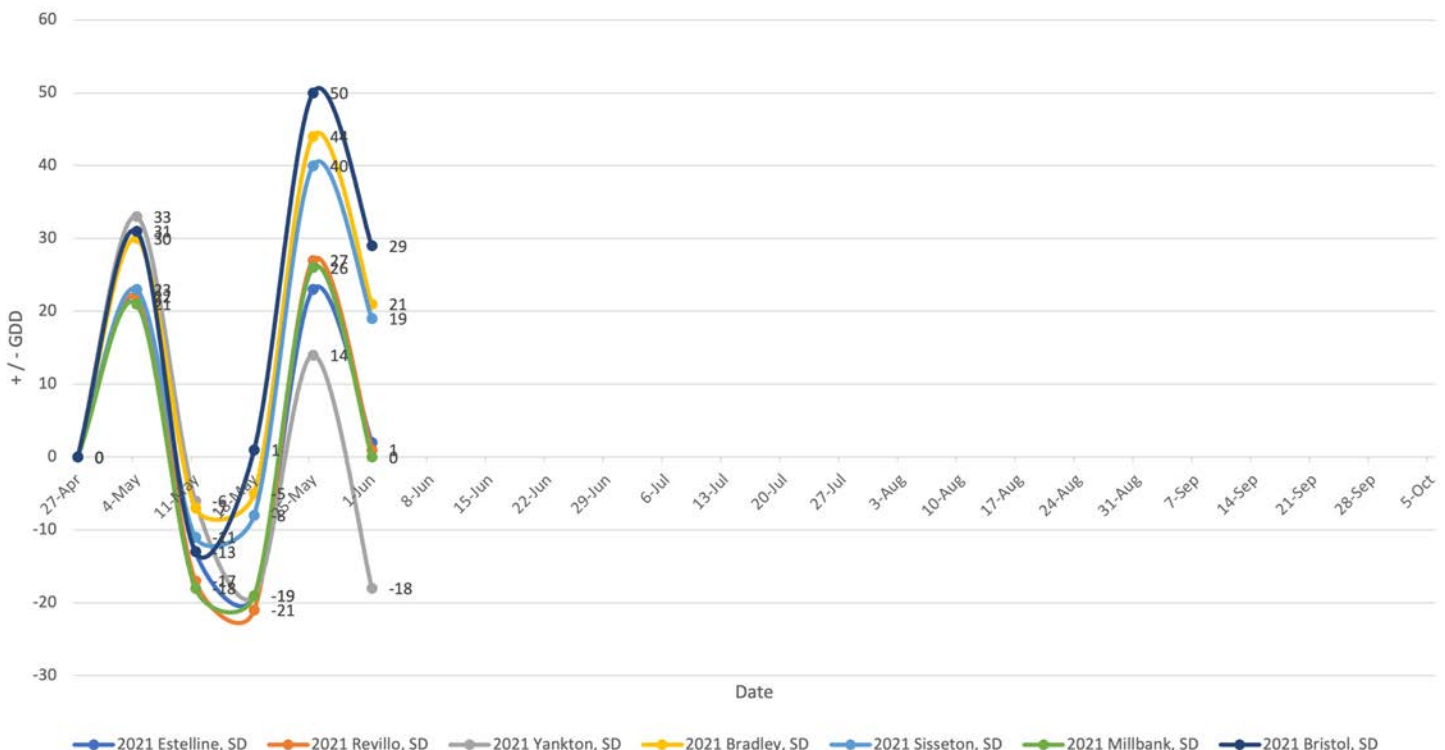

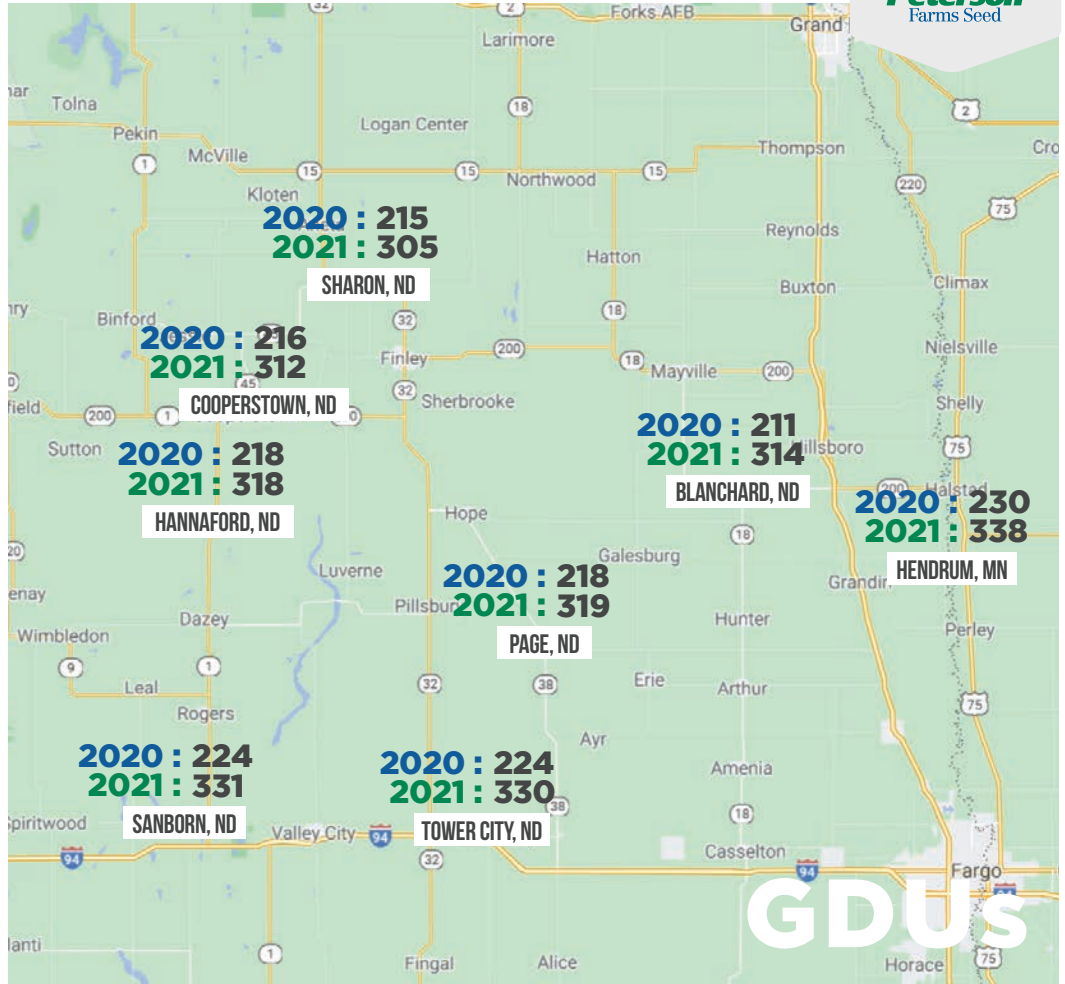
The western part of my territory seems to have gotten the worst, with minimum tillage showing the most damage.



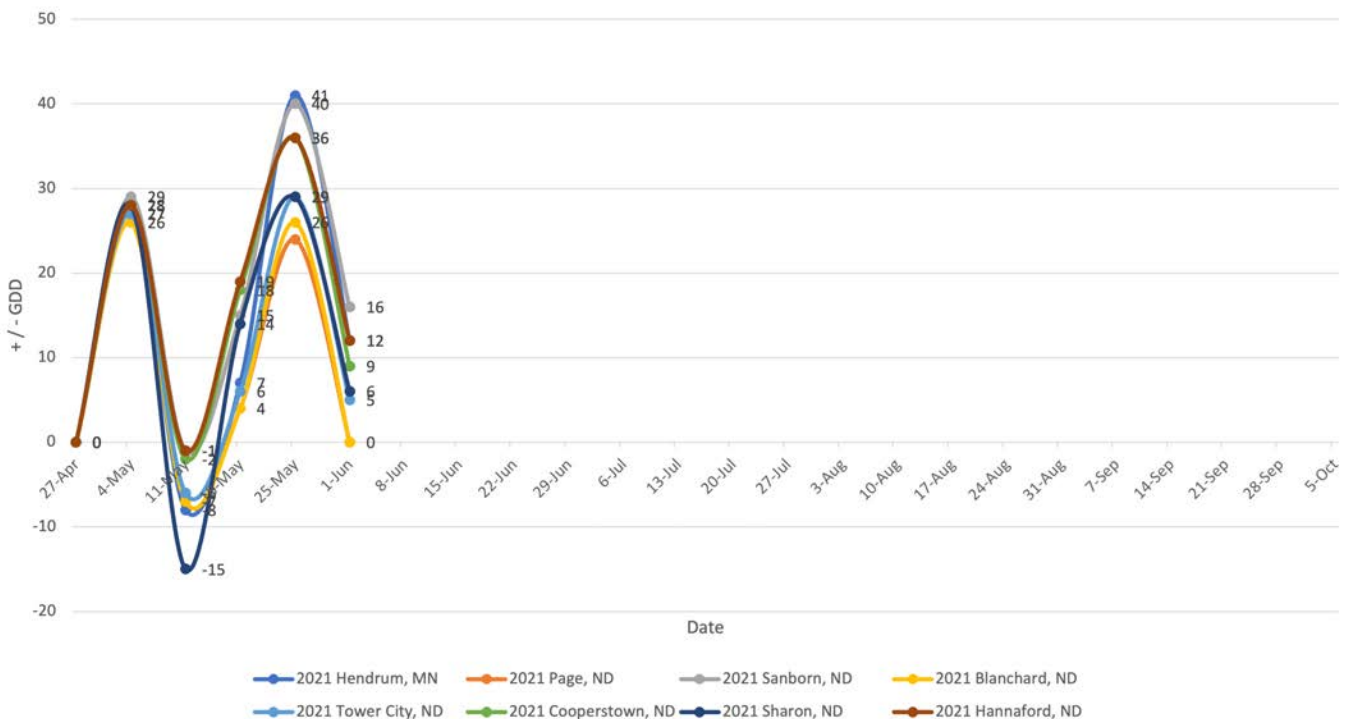

Rain would be welcome over the entire territory and will be important for replanted soybeans.

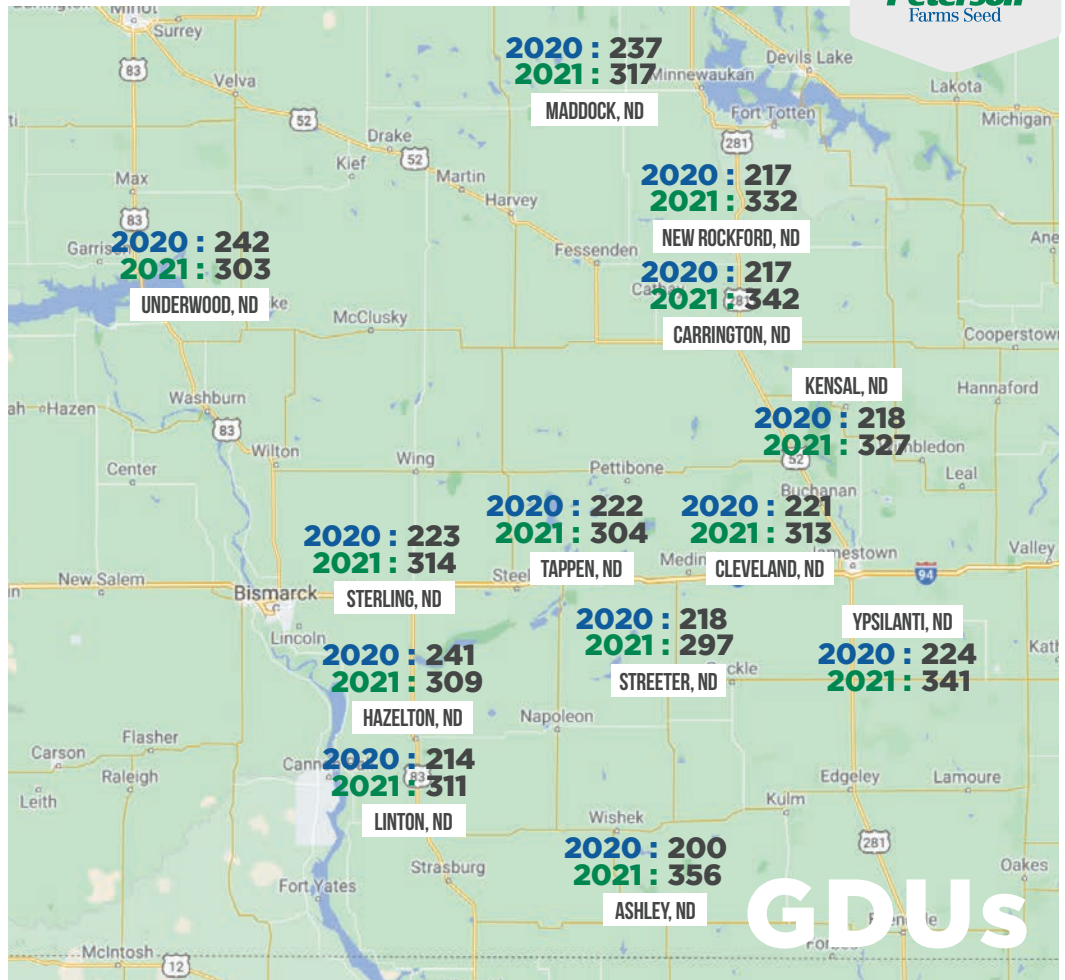
The beans and corn grew considerably over the long weekend and are looking really good.



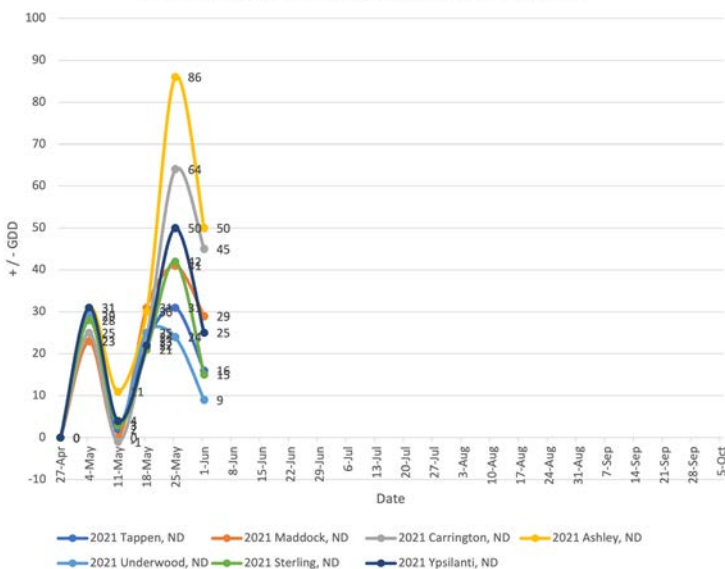

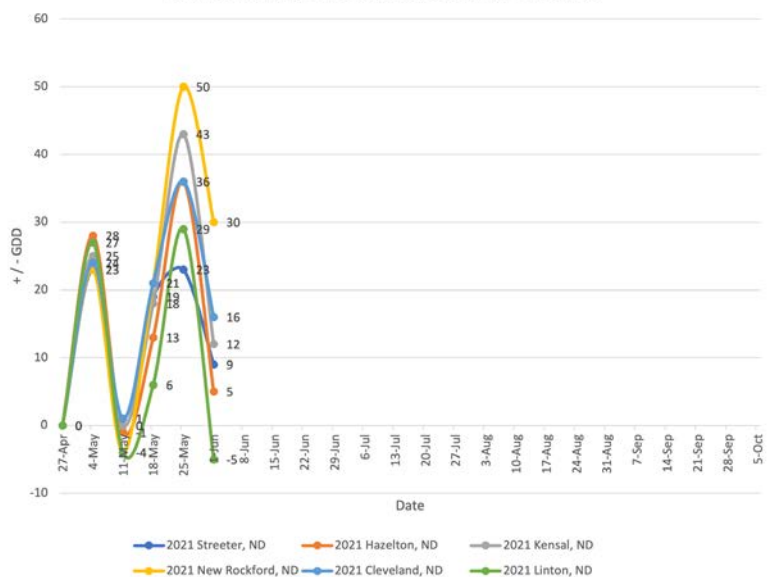

We, thankfully, seem to have avoided major frost damage but the wind gusts have been more problematic.

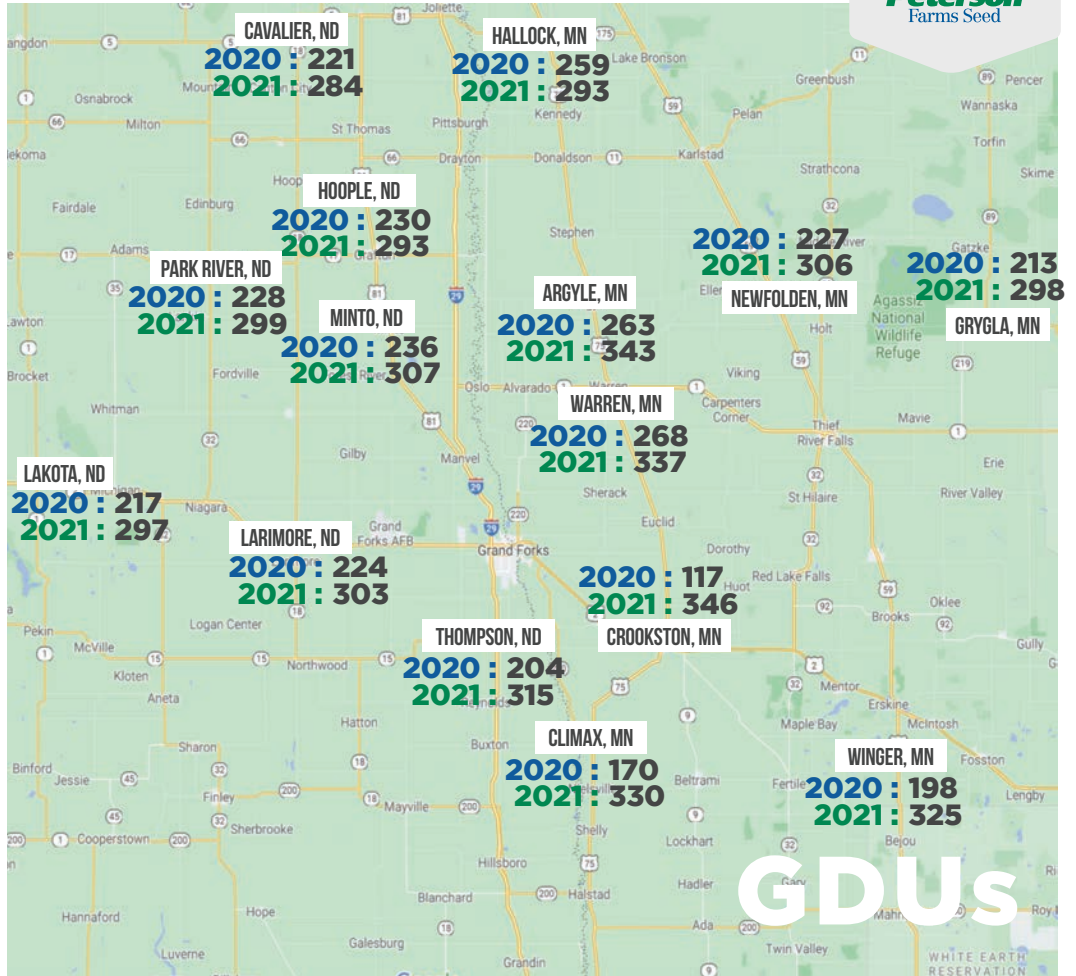
On top of that, some areas received too much moisture and others can't catch any.

Some of the corn looks amazing and the upcoming heat should help drive it this week.

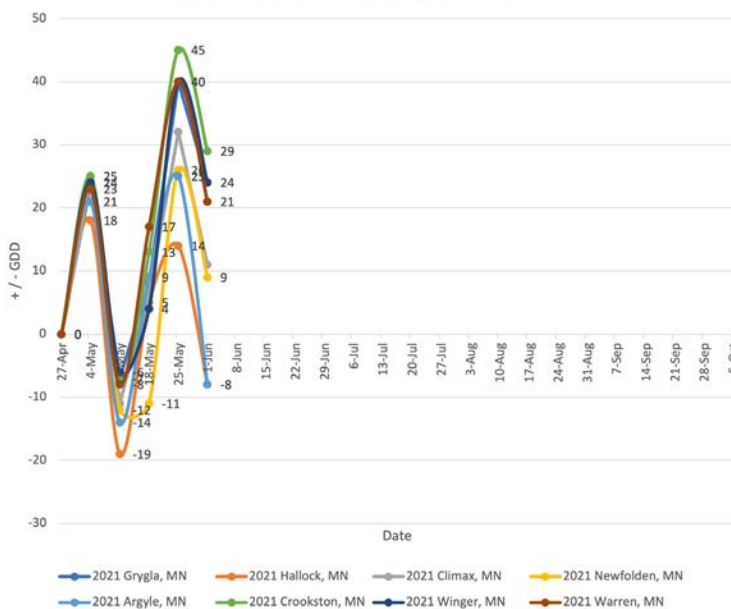

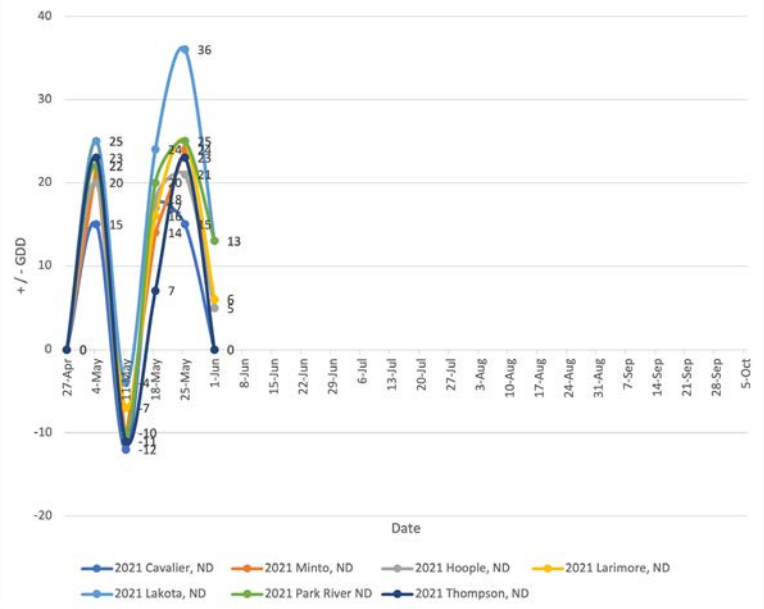

Many fields that looked bad through the weekend are starting to show signs of life. Diagnosing damage accurately is going to be paramount throughout the next 7 days.

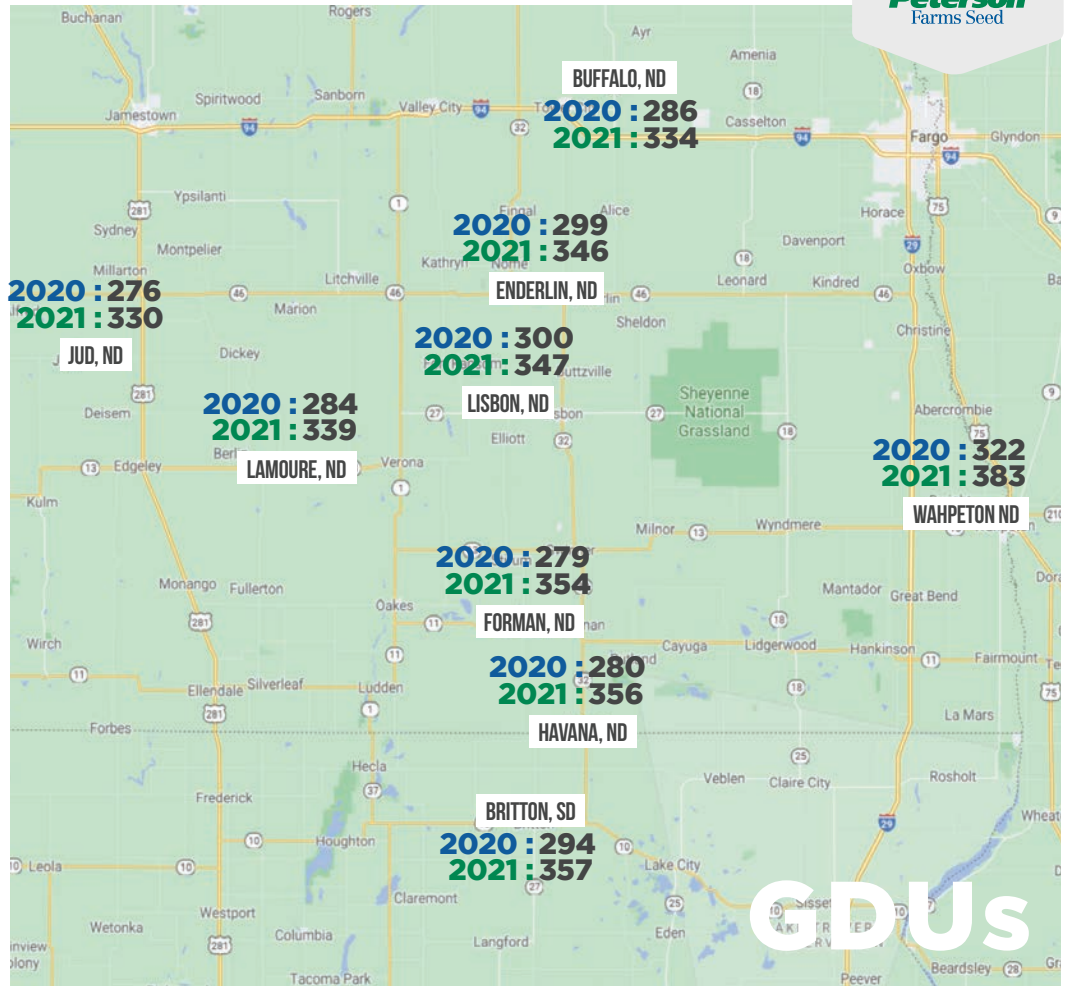
My fingers are crossed for a slow inch of rain.



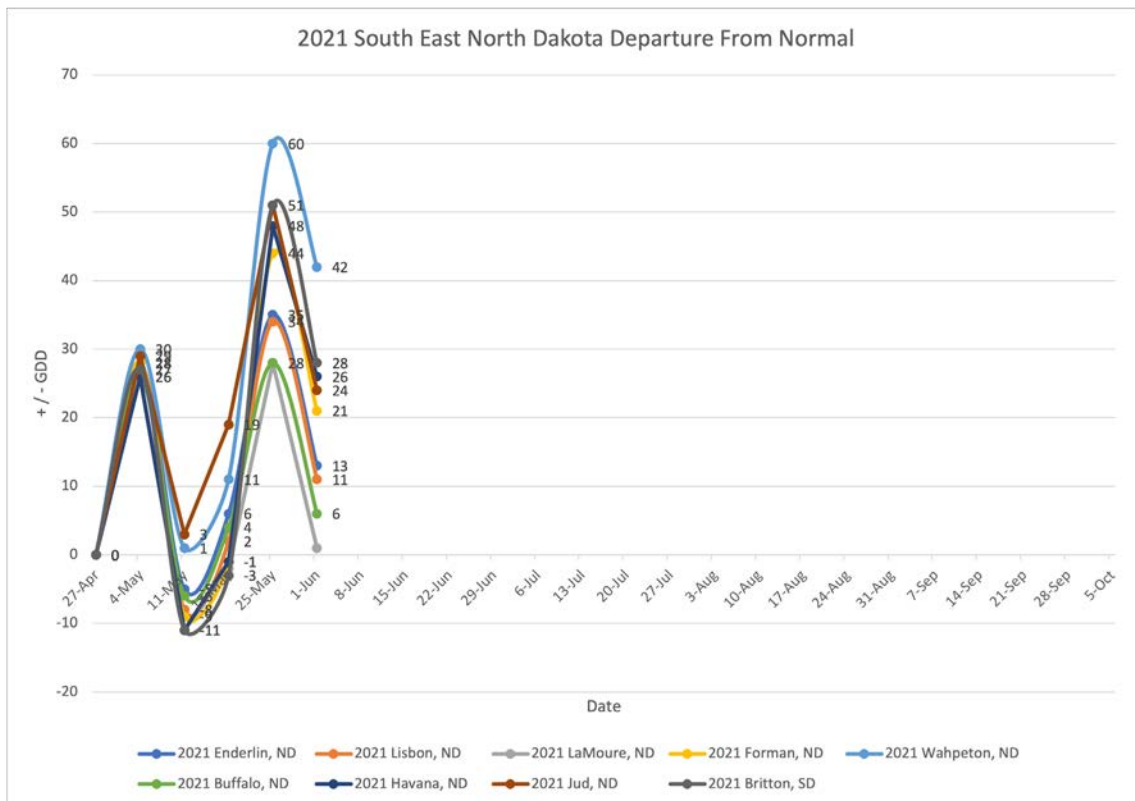

The wind and frost were tough on the crop last week, with a few farms having to replant soybeans.

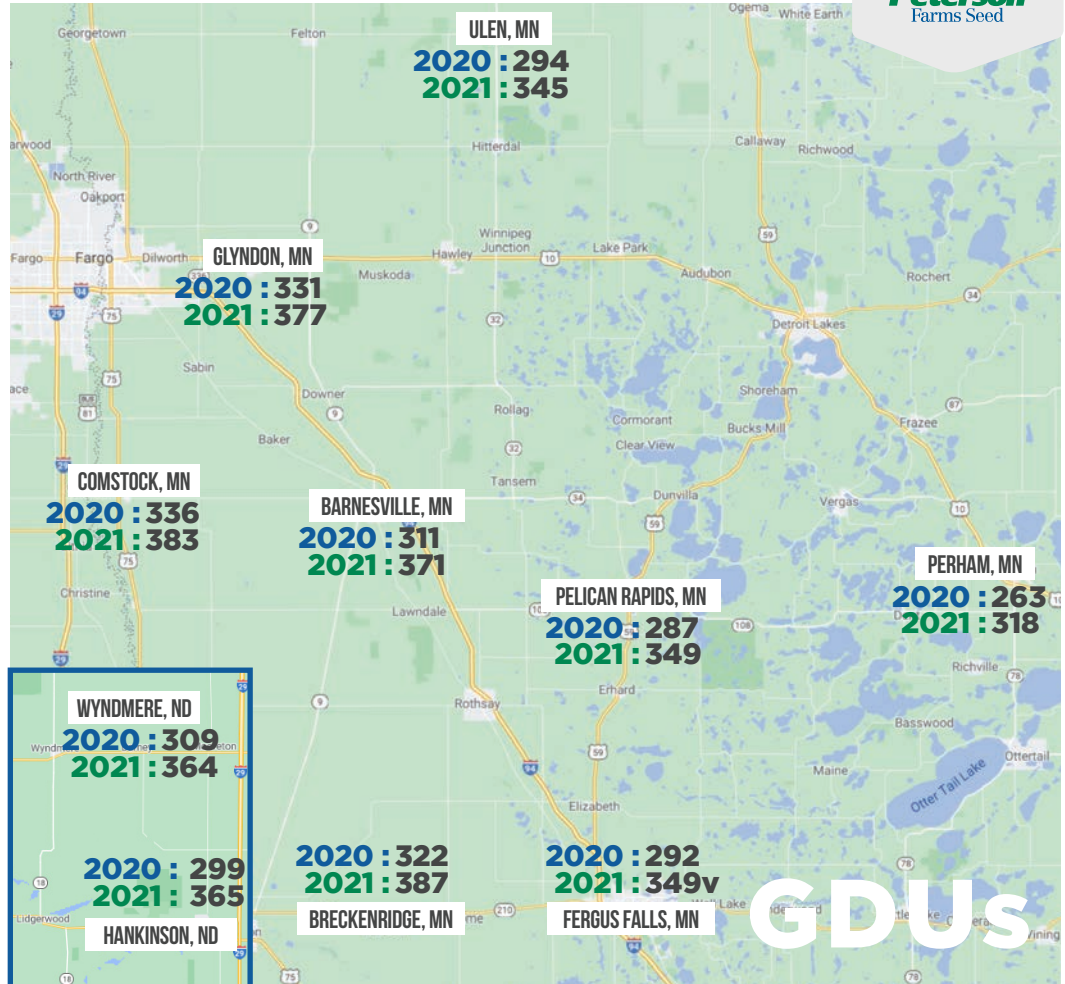
We missed the rain to the south last week so some rain soon is a must.

The undamaged corn is V3 and soybeans are starting to push their 1st trifoliate.

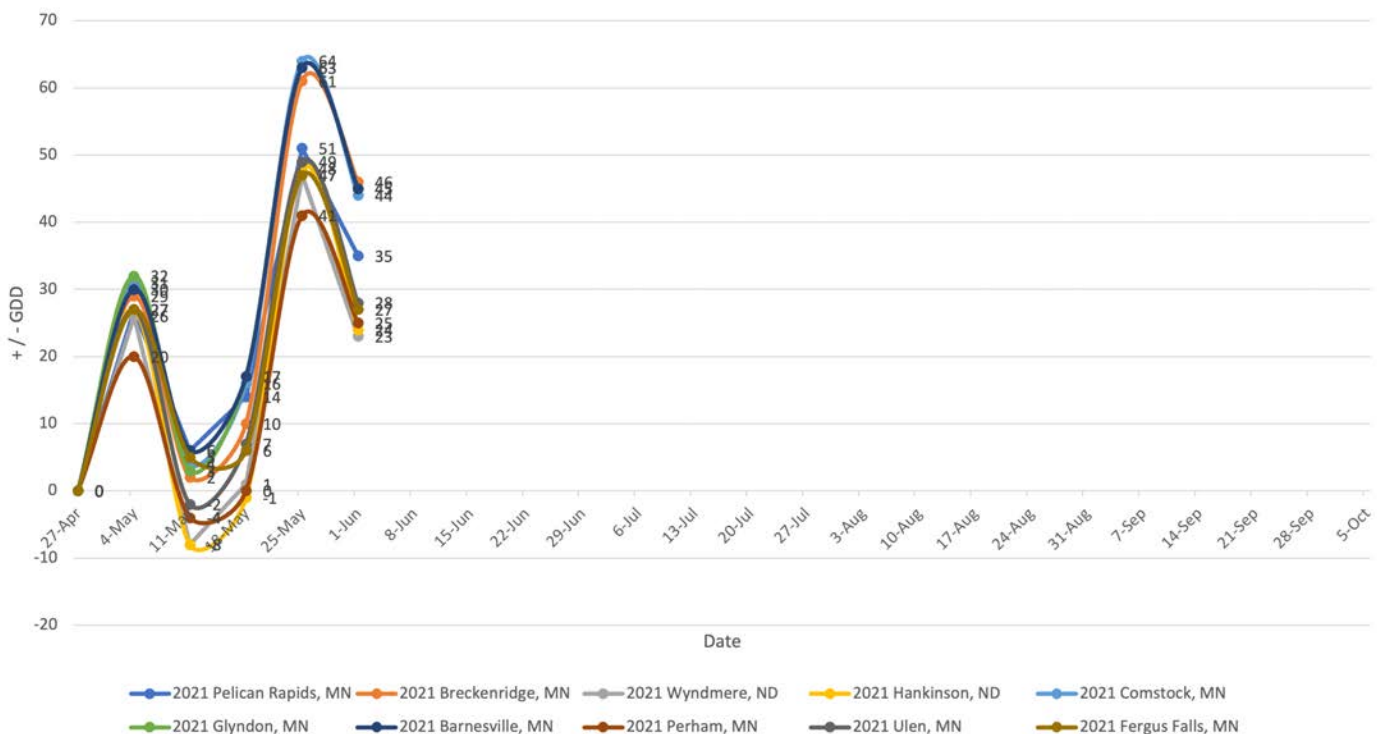

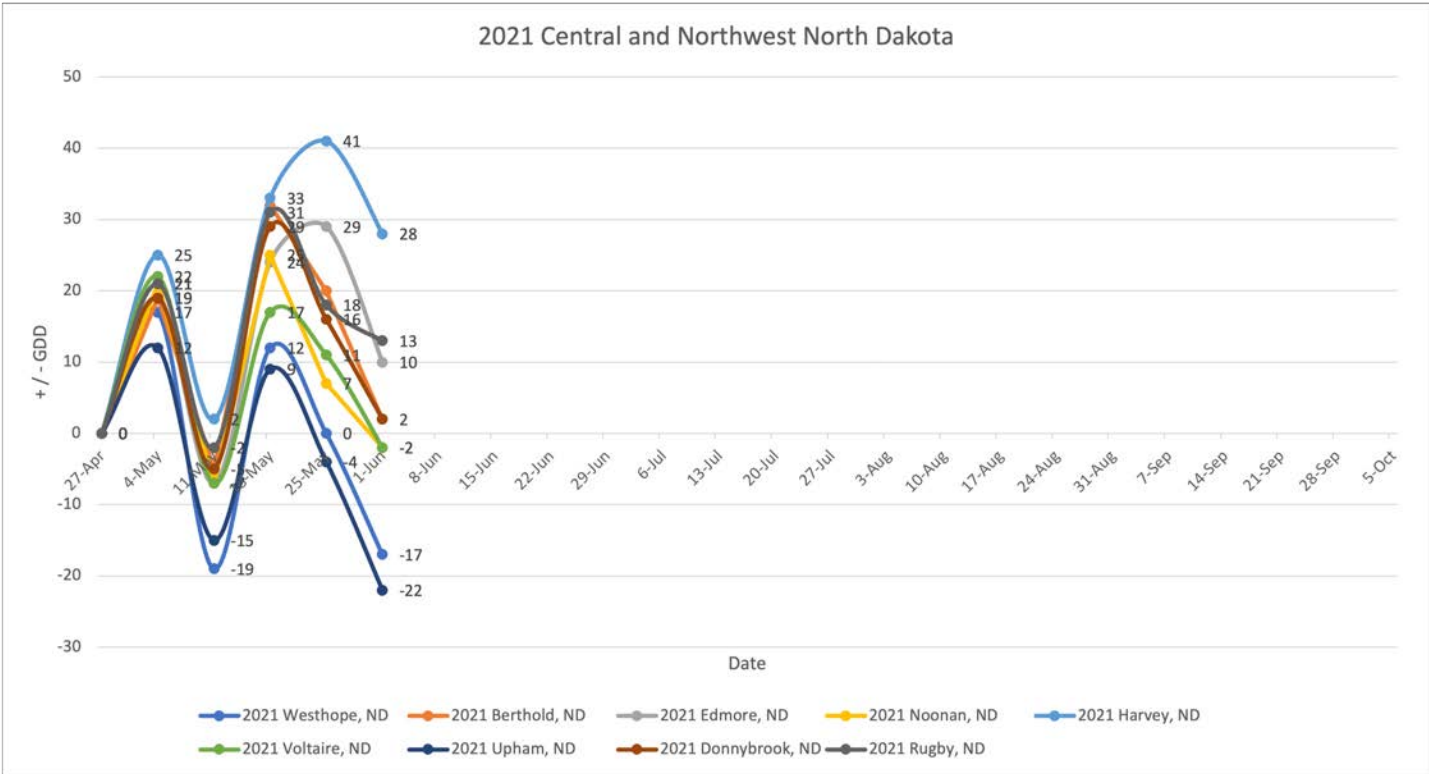
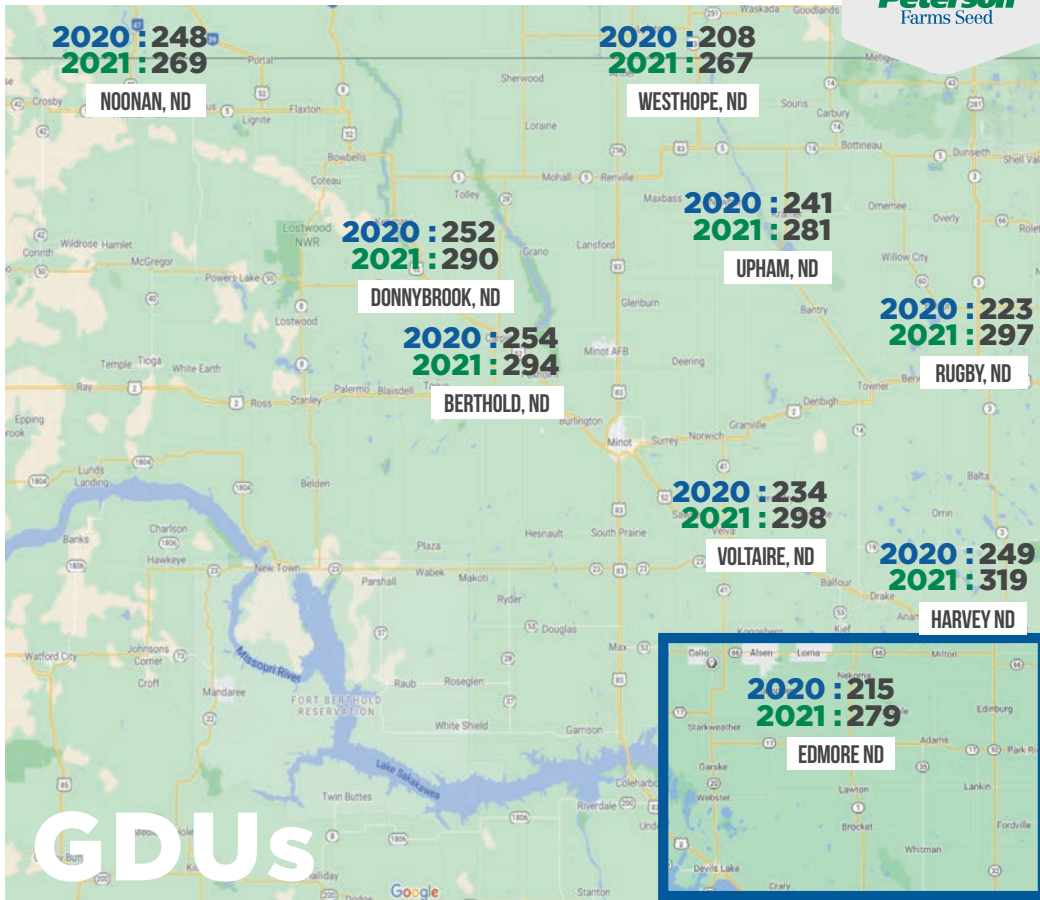

We saw very little frost damage on the leaf tips and plants are already starting to green up.

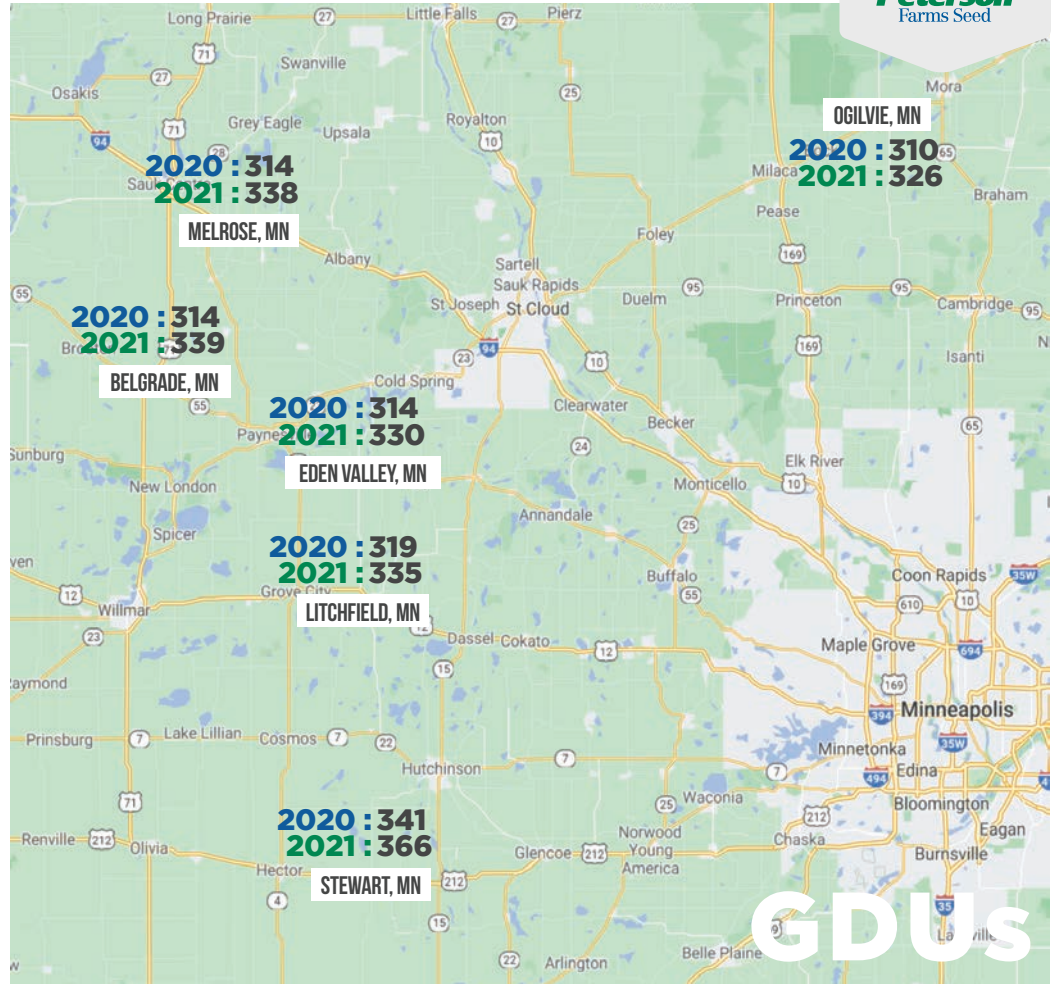
Soybeans are pushing out trifoliates. The rain has also helped germinate the last few beans that were laying in dry dirt.



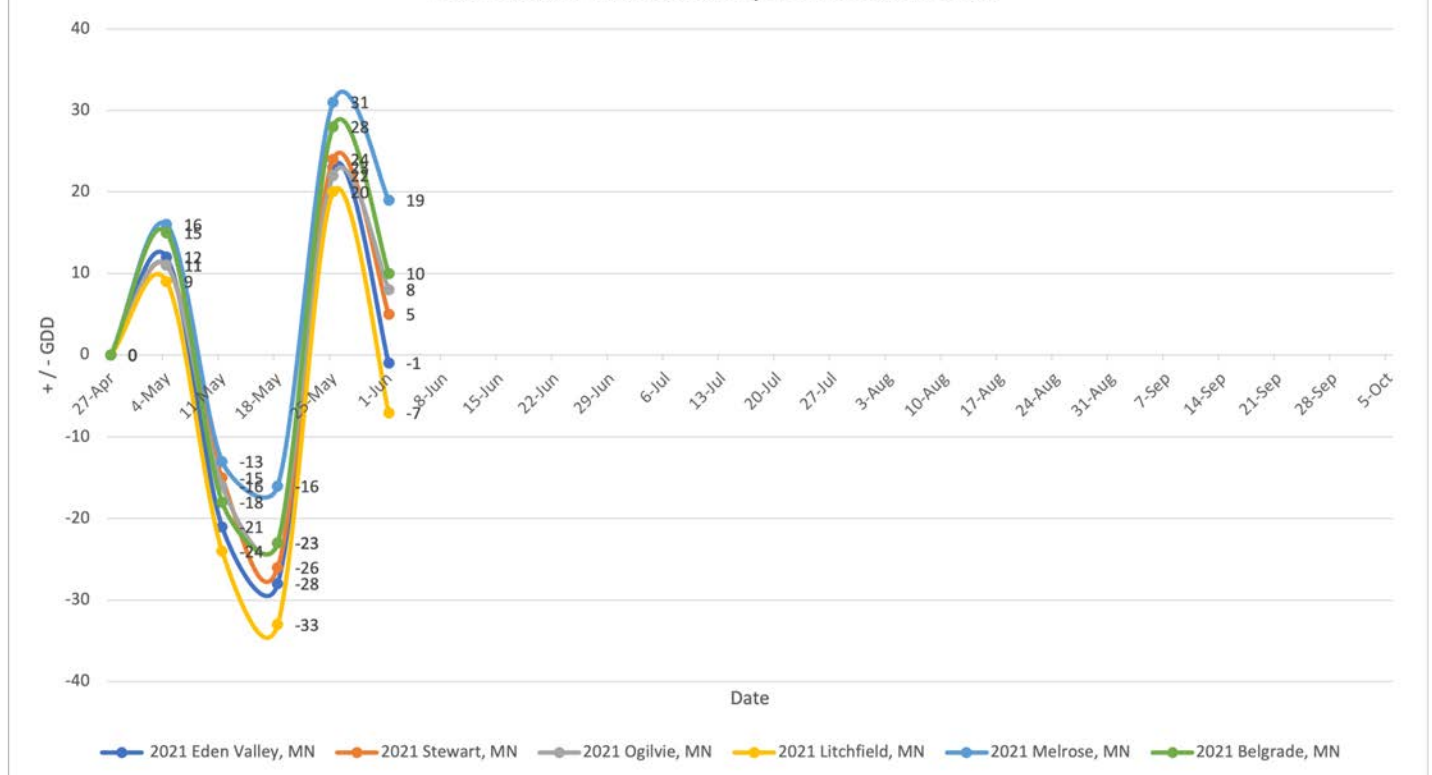

PFS RETAIL LOCATIONS



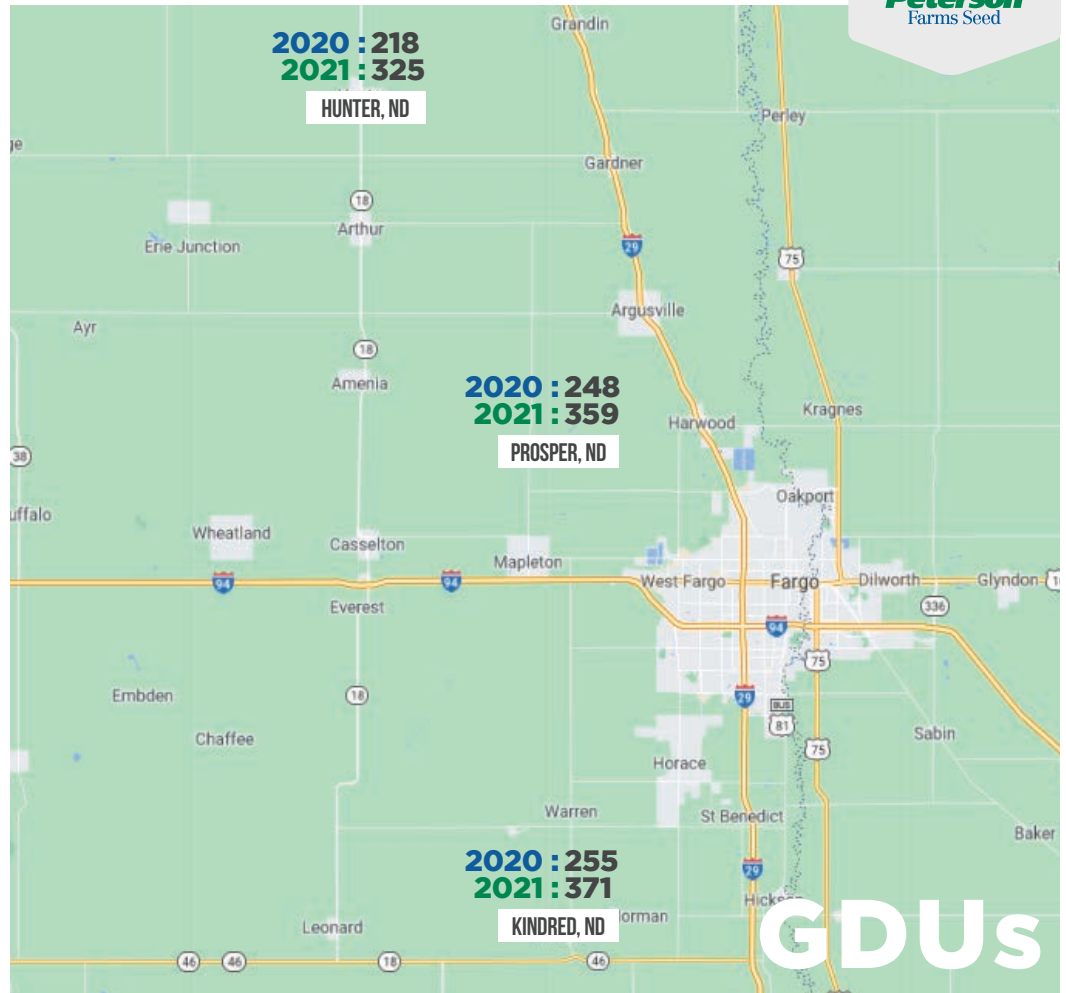
