

We, thankfully, avoided most of the frost last week and most areas received some much needed moisture.


The crop stands vary from excellent to much less than ideal. The forecast for the week is temperatures close to 100 and little moisture in the forecast.


A few bean leaf beetles are starting to appear.

The corn and beans look good!


Most places got .5-1.5" of rain last Thursday and many got an additional .25".


Some post corn herbicides are being applied this week and more alfalfa is getting cut around the area.

My territory escaped the frost largely unscathed.


In the northern fringe, frost evidence is easy to find but does not appear to have been serious.


Further south, a large area received a great soaking rain which helped protect from the cold temps.

#### **WEEKLY NOTES**



The western part of my territory seems to have gotten the worst, with minimum tillage showing the most damage.




After our 3-day wind event and a couple of very cool nights we are looking forward to a few days of warm weather out here.


Rain would be welcome over the entire territory and will be important for replanted soybeans.


The beans and corn grew considerably over the long weekend and are looking really good.

On top of that, some areas received too much moisture and others can't catch any.


Some of the corn looks amazing and the upcoming heat should help drive it this week.







Many fields that looked bad through the weekend are starting to show signs of life. Diagnosing damage accuratley is going to be paramount thoughout the next 7 days.


My fingers are crossed for a slow inch of rain.


The wind and frost were tough on the crop last week, with a few farms having to replant soybeans.


We missed the rain to the south last week so some rain soon is a must.

Soybeans are from VE to 1st trifoliate and corn is from VE to V2.


We saw some pockets of frost damage on soybeans in a few places.


The heat is moving things along quickly.

Crops are growing like crazy and farmers are doing a lot of corn spraying.


Lack of moisture in some areas is adding some variability to the stands, however most are looking very good with the rain last week.


We saw very little frost damage on the leaf tips and plants are already starting to green up.
