


Dry conditions persist over most of the area. The high temperatures are causing stress to all crops. Overall, though, things look surprisingly good for the conditions we have.


We do have some rootless corn syndrome showing up and grasshoppers multiplying in the west.

Corn is in V8-V10 and is looking great!


We're starting to see some rough hill tops in both corn and beans from the heat.


A lot of soybean spraying is getting wrapped up on first pass herbicide.

A nice slow rain covered much of the northern part of my territory on Sunday. The amounts varied, but .5" was a common number.


The corn is progressing nicely with the rain.


At the start of last week, I spotted a few soybean flowers, which will increase rapidly this week now that we're past the summer solstice.


We got a much needed rain Sunday.

Farmers saw .5-1.2" in different areas, which really helped to push some of the later planted or replanted beans along.



#replant2021 seems to be complete... for now.


There are a lot of tough looking fields in my territory, but hopefully a few timely rains can turn things around.


Just about everyone got at least .5" of moisture on Sunday, with a few areas getting a bit more.



Despite things still being super dry, the beans are hanging in there.


Corn is holding its own as well and has grown like crazy in last week with most at V8-10 stage.


We are all still hopeful for more showers!




A fair amount of my area received some much needed rain last weekend. While not everyone received what they wanted, it looks like totals ranged from .30-.70".


I'm seeing more and more corn fields showing rapid growth syndrome, which farmers should know is just cosmetic and won't do any damage to development.




We received .3 - 1" of rain on Sunday which was needed.


Some of my region received some rain since last week, which was sorely needed.



We got a much needed shot of rain across my territory this weekend.




Soybeans are really starting to take shape. Things were progressing really slowly, but with this last shot of rain, it seems like canopies are starting to take shape and we are starting to see some height.

Kindred: Most of the corn side dressing will be wrapped up in the next couple of days. A lot of soybeans will be getting a second herbicide application this next week. The replanted soybeans are coming in really nice for the most part. The damaged soybean stands that growers left are starting to fill in surprisingly well.

Prosper: Soybeans are finally looking like something worth looking at! We haven't seen any soybean aphids yet. The Enlist chemical has been 100%. Wheat – The planes were busy this week applying fungicide and insecticide to kill ahpids and grass hoppers.

Corn – a lot of the corn is over knee high – should be above the belt by the 4th of July!
